Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

Chag sameach! I hope each of you are having a fantastic Passover. My holiday has been filled with family, new friends, and a *seder* with my CDT community. How could it be any better?

One of the most important messages we have as Jews during this time of year comes to us from the *seder*. In fact, this message comes from the very last words that are read at the *seder*, just before we begin singing to conclude the festival meal. These words are: *l'shanah haba'ah b'yerushalyim!* Next year in Jerusalem! These words have been on the lips of Jews the world over for the last two thousand years as we, as a people, have yearned to set foot in our ancient homeland. We are reminded of the importance of Israel and Jerusalem each time we sit down for the *seder* on Passover and, in fact, each time we pray and face east towards the Holy Land.

The exciting thing about this year's *seder* was that, for many in our congregation saying these words, we will have the ability to actually be in Jerusalem next year, as CDT will take its inaugural trip to Israel as a congregation. This exciting opportunity, which will take place from February 2-12, 2019, will give my fellow travelers and me the opportunity to tour throughout Israel, seeing sites in Tel Aviv, the Galilee, the Golan, Tzfat, Masada and the Dead Sea, and, of course, Jerusalem. We will learn about the ancient history of the Jewish people, experience the flourishing and exciting modern state of Israel, and learn firsthand what it means to be in the Jewish homeland. And it is my hope that this trip will be the first of many, held at different times of year, for our congregational family.

So, I would like to invite you to do two things:

Cantorial Soloist's Message

Shalom Chaverim,

Of all of the Jewish Holy Days, I find Passover makes me think most about my Jewish ancestry — about where I, as a Jew, come from. Throughout the *seder*, we speak over and over of the great miracles that God did for us as we were freed from oppression. We tell the story of Passover and imagine that it was each one of us who was a slave and then freed. We reenact the plagues. We eat the hastily-made bread that our ancestors might have eaten as they hurried to leave Egypt, having finally been granted a chance to escape from slavery. We taste the tears of our ancestors as we dip greens into salt water. During the *seder*, we also take great effort to make sure that the next generation, our children, learn the story — that is, learn how it was that we were delivered from bondage to become God's people — *B'nei Yisrael*.

Passover is not just about connecting to our past. It is about connecting to our future, as well. Part of the celebration of Passover is to make sure to pass on our traditions and stories to the next generation, so that they too can be part of the story of us.

In that spirit — the spirit of passing down — I'd like to tell you about a former congregant whose family has helped us to start a scholarship for our youth that will help us continue handing down our traditions and inspiring the next generation of Jews.

Matthew and Susan Newman were members of CDT for some time. I had the wonderful pleasure of preparing their son, John (Matthew has an older son, Jacob), to read from the Torah as he became a Bar Mitzvah in 2009. Matt and John came to services throughout the years. They always made a point to come up and say "hi" to me. Matthew's smile was infectious, as was his son's. They always seemed to be overjoyed to be praying with us on Shabbat. A few years ago, Matt started showing up to Shabbat services in crutches. I didn't think much of it at the time. I knew that Matt was very physically active. I thought that perhaps he was dealing with a sports-related injury. He and John didn't make a big deal about the crutches. They still had their big warm smiles. Soon after Matt was using crutches, he and John attended services. This time, though, Matt was in a wheelchair. Soon after that, he was in a more involved wheelchair that propped his head up. Unfortunately, Matt was suffering from ALS. No matter Matt's condition, not once did he and his son greet me with anything less than a big warm smile and a heartfelt "*Shabbat Shalom*."

Sadly, Matthew Newman passed away at his home on the 22nd of December, 2016. Among the many beautiful things said of Matt and his extraordinary life, at the end of his obituary it read, "Lastly, he loved attending Shabbat services at the Dor Tamid Reform Synagogue. Matt cherished his religion and has passed this passion down to his sons."

In mid-2017, Susan Newman stopped by the synagogue and made a wonderful donation in Matthew's honor. She told me that Matt was so happy to attend services and that they were so grateful for the educational opportunities provided to their family. From this donation, we created the Matthew Newman Scholarship for Youth Development. With this scholarship, we can, in Matt's name, continue to pass down our traditions and help inspire and educate the next generation of Jews. When you think of giving financially to CDT, please consider this scholarship as a way to ensure that our next generations can sit at the *seder* table during Passover and tell our story as if they too were freed from Egypt.

At the end of the Passover *seder*, we say "*L'shanah haba-ah b'Y'rushalayim!*" Next year in Jerusalem! We have already used the Matthew Newman Scholarship for Youth Development to help send one of our amazing youth to Israel. That student is there at this very moment celebrating *Pesach*.

Happy Spring and *Chag Pesach Sameach!* I hope that your seders were meaningful and that, while thinking about how G-d brought our ancestors out of the bondages of slavery in Egypt, you, yourself have been giving thought to what you can do, both individually and as part of our community, to free others from the bonds that tie them down — some of those being hunger, poverty, homelessness, human slavery and trafficking, illness, gun violence, and threats of deportation (just to name a few).

Our social action committee has been busy collecting food for the Atlanta Community Food Bank through our **Homes Against Hunger** program and the food bins in the lobby of CDT. Our last food collection in early March yielded 5 bins full of food. Our next food collection for Homes Against Hunger will be a little different, though. 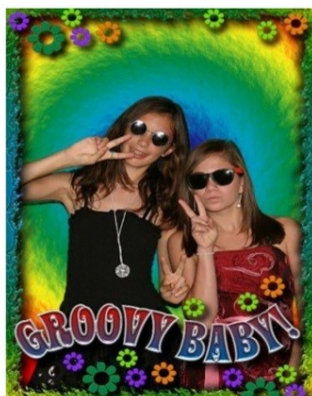
