# **Rabbinic Reflections**



Dear friends,

As you are receiving this month's newsletter, we are just on the cusp of another new year. We began this process of welcoming the New Year at the beginning of the previous Hebrew month of Elul, and we ratcheted into high gear with *Selichot*.

This ceremony, which always falls on the Saturday just prior to Rosh Hashanah (provided said Saturday occurs more than one day before the holiday — hence the 8-day separation this year when Selichot fell on September 1), is our formal introduction to the Days

of Awe: our Torahs' mantels are switched to white to symbolize the purity of this season, we change our *nusach* (the ritual melody of our prayers) to the familiar High Holy Day melodies, and we begin to say the *vidui*, the prayers of repentance and confession that account for our sins. Most importantly, we begin to say words of *Selichot*, words of pardon, asking forgiveness of God for times that we have missed the mark in the past year.

But the message of the High Holy Days that is necessary to keep in mind, as we begin to ask forgiveness from the Divine for the time we have not lived up to our best selves, is that the true work of *t'shuvah*, repentance, is not between us and God, but between us and our fellow people. We are taught that the work on Yom Kippur is not complete unless we are forgiven by those people we have wronged, and so, as we begin this season of repentence, we look to God and we look to each other to say we are sorry and to ask forgiveness.

It is through this process of forgiveness, repentance, and introspection that we can truly enter this New Year and make it is *shanah tovah u'metukah*, a sweet and good New Year.

# Cantorial Soloist's Message

Shalom Chaveirim - Shalom Friends,

I hope you and your family are well. As you are reading this, the High Holy Days are almost upon us. I am looking forward to praying with you, as together we observe our Holy Days. From *Rosh Hashanah*, the Jewish New Year, to *Yom Kippur*, the Day of Atonement, falls the *Aseret Y'mei T'shuvah*, the Ten Days of Repentance. It is during these days that, as tradition teaches, we are to strive in earnest to do *T'shuvah* – to repent. While we should always repent when we make mistakes, *T'shuvah* takes on much greater significance during the *Aseret Y'mei T'shuvah*. Though we do not believe in an actual Book of Life, our imagination has given substance to the idea that our fate is decided by the writing of our names, by God, in either the Book of Life or Death. According to one tradition, there are actually three books. The obviously righteous and wicked are inscribed in the appropriate book, but all the rest – those in the middle – are designated as *beinonim* (in between). According to contemporary tradition, we are all to consider ourselves *beinonim*. It is believed that during the days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, the fate of the *beinonim* can be influenced by how one behaves. During this period of time, many Jews pay careful attention to avoid gossip, to be helpful, and to give charity. Others will make sure to reach out to those they have may have wronged and make amends as well as ask for forgiveness.

Whether or not you believe that you can influence your fate by your behavior – and there justifiably continues to be passionate debate regarding that subject, I think that there is a lesson to be learned as it comes to considering ourselves "in between". Most of us find ourselves guilty of having missed the mark in so many ways throughout the year. At times, some of us have not been good friends, good parents, loving spouses, honest, charitable, accepting . . . and the list goes on. But, our failures as human beings do not completely define us. We remain in between, always with the potential to be more righteous – that is, better.

And so it is with this mindset that I hope you can enter the High Holy Day season. As we each strive to acknowledge our own "in-between-ness", may we be strengthened and encouraged to accept that our failures don't define us and that there is always a chance to change for the better.

# **Social Action**

As this New Year begins, we are reminded in our liturgy about how "good deeds" can make God's light shine more favorably upon us. CDT's Social Action Committee dedicates itself to the ideals of "tikkun olam" — making the world a better place/repairing the world throughout our year. Throughout the past few years, under the direction of Lesley Radov, we have maintained the Gan Tamid Garden, which provides fresh vegetables and fruits for local food coops. Last year we prepared food and served it at the Zaban Shelter seven times between October and April. We collected food through our Homes Against Hunger program and lobby food collections to benefit the Atlanta Community Food Bank and Jewish Family & Career Services. We held a coat drive for winter clothes for the benefit of the North Fulton Community Charities, as well as collected supplies for the victims of Hurricane Harvey. Annually, we support and march in the Pride Parade along with other Jewish institutions under the "umbrella" of SOJOURN (Atlanta's Jewish Diversity Organization) and participate in raising money for the Hunger Walk.

This year, here a few of the projects we will be undertaking with your help and generosity:

- Collect coats (gently used or new) for the Coat Drive, benefitting the Zaban Couples Shelter and North Fulton Community Charities through October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018
- Walk in the Light the Night Walk on October 6, 2018 at 5:30 benefitting the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society
- March along with SOJOURN, as their own Rabbi Lesser is the grand marshal of the Pride Parade in Atlanta on October 14, 2018
- Collect food from your home or via drop offs at CDT for Homes Against Hunger
- Prepare and serve food at the Zaban Couples Shelter on specific dated October through April
- Bag "rice and beans" for the hungry
- Make blankets for the patients at Cancer Centers of America

I'd like to extend special thank you to Bonnie Harvey and Lesley Radov for maintaining the Gan Tamid over the past several months.

We can all make a difference, one at a time or as a community of caring. I would love to see more congregants involved in our committee and with our projects.
