Rabbinic Reflections



Dear Friends,

I want to share some very exciting and big news for CDT. A few years ago, we initiated an endowment fund with our Kulanu B'Yachad campaign. The purpose of an endowment fund is to provide long-term financial stability by providing annual investment income to supplement the operating budget. The endowment principle remains untouched in perpetuity and is invested in low-risk programs which produce consistent annual income for the congregation.

The exciting and big news is that three very generous families have recently pledged a total of \$1.25M to the CDT endowment fund! In memory of his parents, CDT's long-time friend, Danny Warren, donated \$1,000,000 to create the "Dr. Harold and Mildred (Terry) Warren Memorial Endowment Fund." This fund will provide investment income to supplement CDT general operating expenses. I, along with our Board, extend our deepest gratitude to Danny for his generosity and kindness. The Board has approved naming our general endowment fund per Danny's wishes.

In addition, Mitch and Lisa Skyer and Scott and Rachel Allen each donated very generous gifts to create and fund a "directed" endowment specifically designed to ensure that CDT always has the ability to fund the position of Senior Rabbi. The "Congregation Dor Tamid Senior Rabbinical Endowment Fund" is also an investment-based fund, with the difference being the investment proceeds are directed specifically to fund the Senior Rabbi position. This funding does not increase or change the Senior Rabbi's compensation. Rather, it provides funds to the operating budget to subsidize a portion of the Senior Rabbi's salary. Over time, we hope this endowment grows to a point that it fully funds the Senior Rabbi position.

Keep in mind, endowment investments are safe, low-interest returns and designed to increase CDT's long-term financial security. The endowment principle is not to be withdrawn to fund the operating budget, only the investment income. We still must generate income from membership dues, events, and seasonal fundraisers, as well as donations throughout the year that many of you so generously give in memory or in honor of special people in your lives.

This \$1.25M endowment gift is currently a pledge, with legal and financial work to be done in the coming months before CDT actually receives the funds. I just wanted to share the very exciting news, as it truly cements CDT as a leading congregation in north metro Atlanta for decades to come. I must reiterate that, while these fabulously generous donations help us immensely for the future, *this in no way affects our day-to-day operations or the funding for of our synagogue at the present time.* In fact, given the lengthy setup required and time to generate investment returns, we don't expect significant income contributions to CDT for at least two years.

These significant endowment gifts do set us on a new path. A clearer path toward future stability, security, and the ability to serve our congregation for generations to come.

I want to thank Danny, Mitch, Lisa, Rachel, and Scott for their generosity and for helping to ensure a strong future for our congregation and community.

Education Director's Message



For the past few weeks, I felt like my old self again. I was able to clear my mind of everything and focus on one goal: Teaching Passover in a fun, exciting, and engaging way, while following the CDC guidelines.

One day, not too long ago, I woke up with a vision. I could see it clearly . . . a Passover drive-through! After sharing my idea with the staff and getting the green light, there was nothing stopping me.

I built 13 stations for the cars to drive through and the younger families to walk through. Each station represented a different highlight of the *seder*: *Kiddush*, *Urchatz*, *Karpas*, *Ma Nishtana*, The Four Sons, The Ten Plagues, *Dayenu*, *Maror*, *Matzah*, *Beitza* (egg) and *Zeroah* (bone).

The students were able to read the prayers from the posters and get explanations from the teachers about what each symbol, song, and prayer meant.

Once the families started to arrive, the adrenaline in my body elevated. It was so exciting to see everyone, even though we were in masks. I could see that the families were learning. I could see they were having a good time. I could see the religious school was still the religious school I remembered!

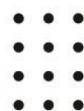

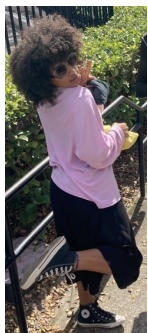
This program assists couples transitioning from homelessness to resettlement and independence by providing shelter, basic necessities, and counseling services.



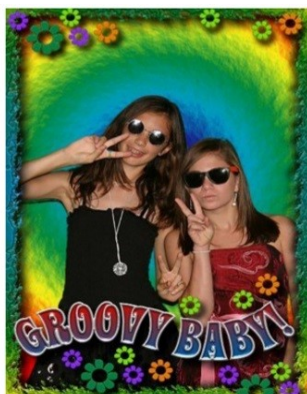
