## Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

We have now entered into a new secular year. And with that transition, for many people, comes the annual tradition of "New Year's Resolutions," which is the secular, Americanized answer to our yearly process (think back to the high holy days) of *cheshbon hanefesh*—the accounting of our souls.

Many of us will make promises to ourselves to lose weight, go to the gym, stop smoking, or any of a number of other ideas to make us better and healthier people. And most resolutions, as many of us realize year after year, go by the wayside after only a few days or weeks.

But this year, our Hebrew calendar reminds us, as we turn the secular calendar, of the power of the resolution to change. We are in the midst of the story of Exodus, and on the Shabbat of the New Year we will read *parshat vaera*, in which we learn that God appeared to Moses and instructed him to change the world by going before Pharaoh and demanding that Pharaoh free the Children of Israel.

This *parsha* and the ones immediately before and after it (*shemot* and *bo*), remind us of the power to stand up to make the world a better place. We read these words as we enter into the new year, which provide us a motivation to change, a motivation to make the world change. And just as we may be willing to give up on these resolutions (along with going to the gym and dieting), we have an exclamation point placed on the Torah's message with *parshat beshalach*, which includes the song of the sea. This portion which is annually read on the Shabbat called *Shabbat shirah* (the Shabbat of song)—and which will include a musical Shabbat—also falls this year on the Friday night of Martin Luther King Weekend. So, in a Jewish way, and a secular way, we are reminded this year that we have the ability to make a meaningful resolution and truly change the world for the better.

I hope you will join me in making this our path in 2022.

Thank you to everyone who made the Afghan Refugee Project a HUGE success. Amy Zuspan, connected us with Catholic Churches Atlanta, as they welcome one hundred Afghan Refugee families. Besides cold weather items for adults, they had requested Welcome Home Bags for the families which included items such as calendars, planners, tea sets, blankets, welcome mats, flashlights, grocery gift cards and various dried fruits and spices for cooking.

## The response was overwhelming!

Our bins were overflowing with clothing plus blankets and other items. There were daily (often multiple times a day) Wishlist deliveries from Amazon. Others were purchasing more affordable items from stores like Walmart and Dollar Tree (who knew you could get calendars for \$1 – although inflation will make them a whopping \$1.25 in the near future). The storeroom where Stacey and Ginny put the donations was so full that the door couldn't be closed.

Several ladies from Social Action, and two fabulous teenagers, Sam and Kate Hall, got together on a Sunday to assemble the Welcome Home Bags and bag the coats, scarves, hats and gloves. Other items will be donated to North Fulton Charities as they are in desperate need of blankets and other clothing items.

In the end, we delivered 6 huge bags of cold weather clothing and 20 bags full of Welcome Home items. The people at CCA were THRILLED to get these donations and were especially delighted by the fantastic Welcome Home Bags.

Thank you also to Edlynn Davis for providing dinner to the Zaban Parodies Center in December. The mission of the Center is to provide services and keep couples and families together as they move from being homeless to being self-sufficient and finding permanent places to live.

## Tikkun Olam Corner

At Congregation Dor Tamid we always have new projects to assist those that need in our community but we also have some ongoing efforts that you can donate to any time.



- ♦ Gan Tamid Garden – Located on the grounds of CDT, in 2021 the garden produced 300 pounds of vegetables and fruit that were donated to the North Gwinnett Food Bank.
- ♦ The Sandwich Project – Once a week, sandwiches are made and delivered to **Chris 180**, an organization whose mission is to heal children, strengthen families and build community.
- ♦ The Chesed Tamid Fund – Donations to this fund allows CDT staff to purchase grocery store gift cards for Congregants that are facing financial issues and would benefit from assistance to feed their families. Gift cards can also be dropped off at the temple for distribution.
- ♦ Tzedakah – The Tzedakah box is located in the lobby when you walk into CDT. Donations are used for a variety of Tikkun Olam projects during the course of the year. We are happy to accept your spare change and singles any time you come to the temple for services and other activities. It will be used to make a difference to those in need in our community.
- ♦ Zaban Parodies – Once a month, members of CDT buy dinner for homeless couples and families that are learning how to be self-sufficient, receiving job training and other skills that will allow them achieve stability and well-being.


## KENTUCKY TORNADO RELIEF FUND


