Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

As June has now arrived, I can't begin to tell you how excited I am. In just a few short weeks, I will have the privilege of, once again, serving on the faculty of a residential Jewish summer camp. While I will be at the URJ Camp Coleman this summer (with a stop at Camp Barney as well), kids from CDT will be attending or working at Coleman, Barney, Judea, Blue Star, Alterman, In the City, and 6 Points, to name just a few. All of our kids are sure to have an amazing summer at their particular camp, which will help them grow as individuals and as Jewish young people.

What is it about Jewish camps that make them so successful at instilling in children Jewish identities so deep that they last a lifetime? "Each camp has a very strong and intentional culture, camp by camp. Camp's power to socialize young Jews—How do I be a Jew? How do I be a member of the Jewish community?—depends on this culture," said Amy L. Sales, co-author with Leonard Saxe of *How Goodly Are Thy Tents: Summer Camps as Jewish Socializing Experiences*. "Culture encompasses everything, from how the Sabbath is observed to never deviating from grilled cheese on Mondays."

Our kids will have the opportunity to live their lives embodying this culture, which is filled with Jewish values, lessons, and Torah. Judaism, at camp, allows our kids to see that Judaism can truly impact each part of their lives in truly meaningful ways. And this interaction with Judaism is truly successful in growing Jewish youth into active Jewish adults. Studies have shown that camp (along with peer trips to Israel) is one of the main things that can help instill lifelong Jewish commitment in our young people.

The challenge, then, is bringing that feeling home when they return. So, I challenge each of us, especially those who have kids at camp this summer, to explore our own Jewish lives and see how we can increase our connection to Judaism on a daily basis, whether we are at CDT, at home, at camp, or anywhere else.

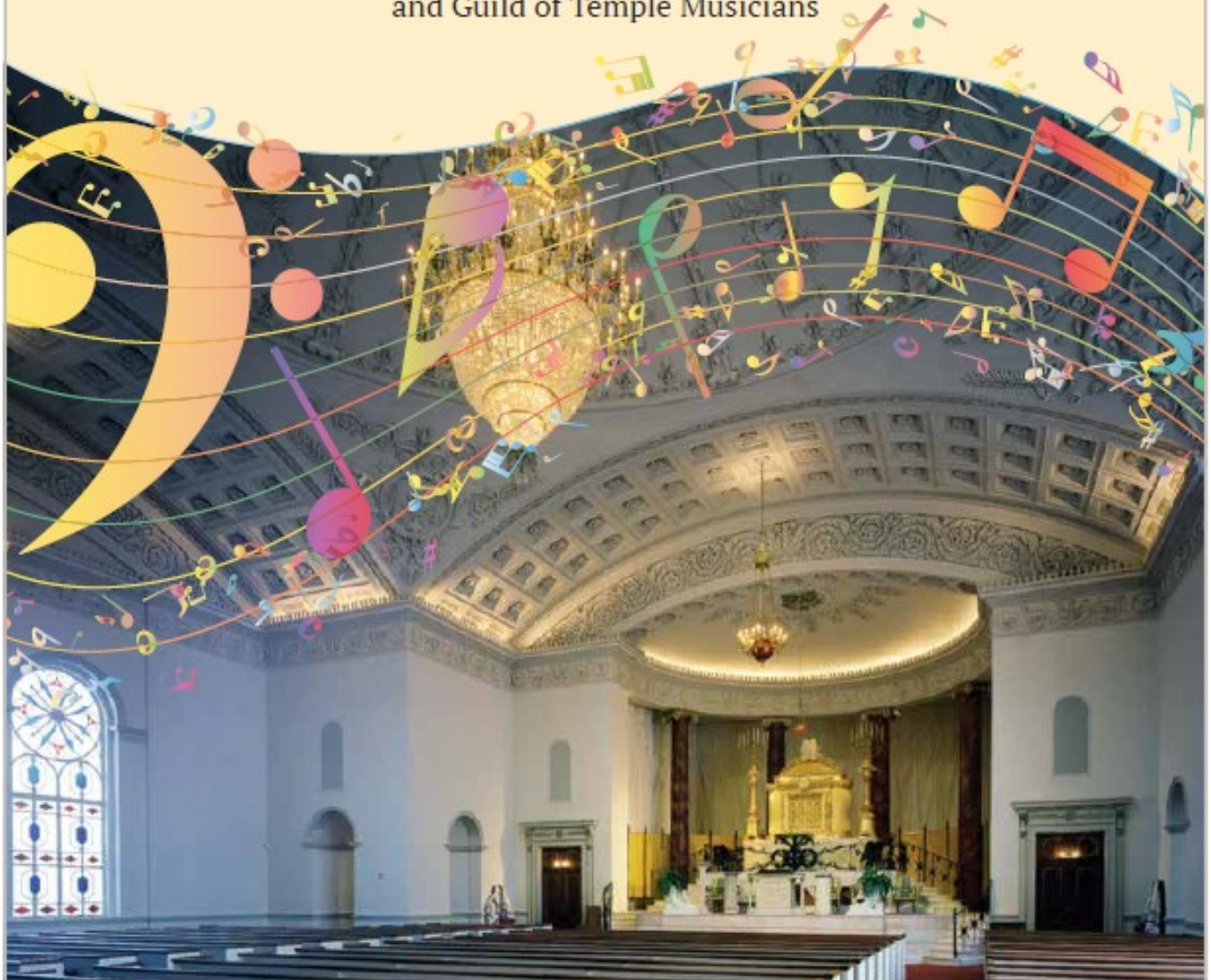

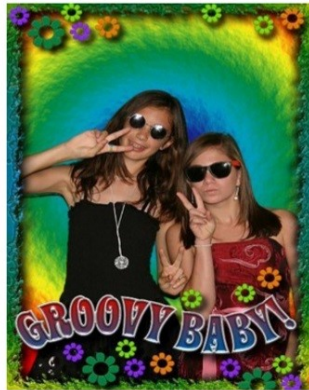
