

## Is he really still talking about the 50-50-50 Challenge? He sounds like a broken record.

By now, you have undoubtedly heard about our new 50-50-50 Challenge at CDT. Over the past few weeks, many of you have asked me why another fundraiser at this time. You are right to ask. Yes, it is an unusual time for a fundraiser at CDT. Yes, it comes on the heels of our End-of-year Giving Campaign. It's clearly not as exciting as a gala or other social-based fundraising event. The answer is simple.

One of our congregant families made a very generous offer with an unusual twist, and we jumped at this opportunity with open arms. We had no plans to reach out to you about fundraising at this moment, but we did and I want you all to understand why . . . and why this is the absolutely right time to come together as one community to match the donated \$50,000 with another \$50,000.

We started the fiscal year with an approved budget that doesn't allow for any wiggle room for spending. Your Board of Directors has spent considerable time and attention this year scrutinizing our budget and tightening our spending to ensure we are on solid financial footing for the future. While our congregation size is certainly lower than it once was, we continue to focus a great deal of attention to marketing and other ways to grow and retain members.

This effort is only part of the solution. The other part rests with you, our congregants, our CDT family. Philanthropy plays an important part in our success. Donations, combined with dues and religious school registrations, are essential to our annual budget, exceptional programming, the maintenance of our 'home,' and the retention of our dedicated clergy and staff.

Knowing that every dollar you contribute to the 50-50-50 Challenge will be doubled, I hope that you will donate generously and help us turn \$50,000 into \$100,000. I personally can't think of a better magic trick than this one!

#### Dear Friends,

I was looking out of my office windows and saw the daffodils emerge from the ground; the daffodils that our religious school planted to commemorate the children who perished in the Holocaust. Many thoughts came to mind . . .

I would like to share with you something personal that I have been feeling lately and that I am sure you can relate to. I am hearing more and more about anti-Semitic remarks made in our children's schools and in our neighborhoods. As a third generation Holocaust survivor, a Jewish Educator and a mother of three, I am concerned. Even though I am concerned, I know that our religious school isn't just accepting this. We are fighting it in a very special way.

When your kids come to religious school, they aren't coming just to learn how to read Hebrew so they can chant at their Bar/Bat Mitzvah. They aren't coming to religious School just to do arts & crafts and to listen to a few different bible stories. They are coming to their synagogue to be with their extended Jewish family which shares with them the same values and history.

We are learning together what it means to be Jewish; we are learning to love being Jewish. The more informed our children become, the more capable they will be to deal with the anti-Semitic remarks that will come their way. We can't run from them; we need to confront them!

We planted the daffodils to learn, to remember and to respect. We must continue our actions by coming to religious school, doing mitzvot, and being together so we can grow as a Jewish family.




