Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

Just a few days ago, I had an incredible opportunity that I want to share with you. If you recall back to my column in the December newsletter, I shared with you the following: During the Second World War, it was the practice of the Nazis in Czechoslovakia to collect *Torah* scrolls and other Jewish books and ritual objects. These holy items were to be used in a "Museum to a Dead

Race" that was planned for the conclusion of the war. Thankfully, this never came to fruition, and, following the war, over 1500 *sifrei Torah* lay in a basement in Prague. These scrolls were then sent to the Westminster Synagogue in London for safekeeping. In deciding what to do with, and how to care for, these scrolls that were a witness to one of the worst tragedies to ever befall our people, the Westminster Synagogue formed the Memorial Scrolls Trust. It is the duty of the Memorial Scrolls Trust to care for these scrolls and to ensure that they are given a prominent role in the spiritual and educational life of the institutions to which they have been entrusted. Each Memorial Scroll is a messenger from a community that was lost, but does not deserve to be forgotten. I was honored, along with our Sisterhood President Lisa Danzig, to be able to travel to Miami to get our new Torah and bring it to its new home in our ark. We all, the members of Congregation Dor Tamid, are now custodians of history, as we welcome this new scroll to join our other *sifrei Torah*.

This *Torah*, labeled by the Trust as MST#49, is from Lostice, Czechoslovakia where Jewish life dates back to 1544. By the end of the century, records mention a synagogue, cemetery, and school, as well as a community register. However, following the Holocaust only one person had survived.

As Lisa and I arrived to pick up our new scroll to bring it home, I was overcome with a mixed sense of emotions: sadness for this lost community, joy that our community is honored with the opportunity to honor their memory, and hope for the future as we will pass on the memory of this community and the wisdom of this *Torah* to future generations. As we accepted possession of this scroll, Lisa and I, and, in effect, each member of our community, truly became, along with the scroll itself, witnesses. We are therefore charged with honoring a memory and making sure we all never forget.

I hope you will join us during our Shabbat service on April 17, as we formally welcome and dedicate our new *Torah* scroll.
