Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

In just a few days, we will celebrate the holiday of Purim with our annual Purim carnival on March 5 and our Purim Spiel and Megillah reading on March 6 (see the enclosed flyers for more information). This holiday always brings with it joy and laughter, from our kids dressing up and playing games at the carnival to our members of all ages laughing and singing at the Spiel. We will gather together to cheer Mordechai and Esther and boo the evil Haman.

Yet, amidst the frivolity of the holiday, it can still teach us an important lesson. We boo and hiss each time Haman is mentioned, hoping to drown out his name and memory as well as all that he represents. But just recently, we have seen Haman in our own midst. From the antisemitic flyers that were posted in metro-Atlanta this past month to antisemitic incidents from celebrities, we are currently seeing Haman in our midst. Then, just this past weekend, we saw hate groups from around the country trying to coordinate a "National Day of Hate." It is truly scary to see Haman amongst us.

First and foremost, a heartfelt thank you to the Johns Creek Police Department for all of the support in ensuring our safety this weekend.

As we continue to witness this rise in antisemitism in our community, we must look to the lessons that Purim teaches us. As we will read from the megillah in just a couple of days, Esther remarks that perhaps she was placed in the position of queen to speak up against the evil Haman. Perhaps each of us, on encountering antisemitism is in that place in order to speak out against hatred of the Jews, to help educate those around us, and to engage in dialogue and relationship building to lessen the unfounded ideas that the anti-Semite spews. The rabbis teach that even when the Messianic Age comes, Purim will be the only holiday to be celebrated. This is because it is a day on which we recall the past hatred and wickedness of the antisemite, Haman, and we remember that it was incumbent upon Esther, just as it is incumbent on each of us to speak out.

Let us not be silent as Haman is among us. Let us continue to boo and hiss and blot out his name, his memory, and all antisemitism from our midst.

President's Message

Today marks the beginning of the last quarter of my presidency of our amazing congregation. I love being a part of and serving this community. Being in this role has taught me many things about myself, congregational life, business, and the blurring of personal and congregational relationships just to name a few. There have been ups and downs over the past few years, but one thing that has been a constant for me is the quality of each person who gives time to our synagogue and the talent and support of our leadership, both professional and lay.

Last month, I had the honor of participating in the Adult B'nai Mitzvah along with 7 of my peers. As part of our process, we each had to write a D'var Torah explaining what our Torah portion is about. Below is an excerpt from my words:

The verses that I chanted are part of the story in which Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, heard the news of all the amazing miracles that G-d did for the Jewish people. Jethro, along with Moses' wife and children, traveled to the desert to meet up with Moses. When Jethro arrived, he saw how busy Moses was as he answered questions from the people every day from morning until night. He explained to Moses that if he continued in this fashion, he would wear himself out. He suggested that Moses appoint judges to smaller groups of people. This way those judges could answer for their people and if they were unable to answer they could go to higher level judges all the way until it reached Moses, if necessary. With this system, Moses would only have to answer the hardest questions, and this would allow him time for other things.

Basically, they created a hierarchy that allowed Moses' load to be delegated to others so that only the largest questions were presented to him. This speaks volumes to me as the current President of our congregation. There is a lot of work that gets done at CDT every day, week, month and year, and many people that take part. Although I am the President, with strong people in roles on the Board of Directors and serving as committee chairs, I can focus on bigger issues for CDT. Leadership can be taxing and having a hierarchical structure in place that breaks the work down into smaller pieces allows everyone to do a more focused and better job.

I consider myself honored and lucky to work with all our leadership. The Board of Directors of CDT is made up of multi-faceted, multi-talented people who work each day to make our congregation the best it can be. Our staff, under the leadership of Rabbi Jordan, is strong, talented, unified and enjoy coming to work each day. I am looking forward to the next three months and beyond...

Our B'nai Mitzvah Students



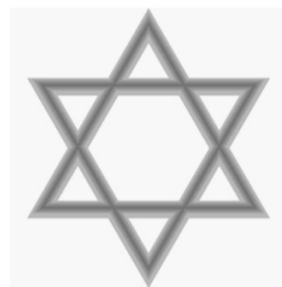


