Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

The month that has just ended brought with it the joys of Passover, complete with its tale of freedom and redemption, its songs, and its delicious food eaten around a *seder* table. It also brought heartbreak, as once again we bore witness to a senseless tragedy as violence struck a synagogue filled with worshipers in prayer. These times, both good and bad, drive us to seek the safety and comfort of our communities, and I want to ensure you that, even at the most trying of moments, whether personal or

communal, your CDT community is here to stand with each one of you.

At the end of the second *seder*, there is a short prayer that is added, which is not present on the first night. This prayer is for the *mitzvah* of counting the *omer*, the 49 days (or in other words 7 weeks of 7 days) that exist between the Exodus from Egypt on Passover and the Divine Revelation at Sinai on Shavuot. Rather than counting down the days to Revelation, as we count down towards other events and milestones such as graduations or vacations, the *omer* counts up, adding value to each day as we get closer and closer to receiving the Torah.

When we have finished counting the *omer*, we end up, once again, with all Jews of all time, at Mt. Sinai on the night of Shavuot to be witness to and celebrate the sacred moment of Revelation, where God blessed our people by giving us the Torah. Our tradition tells us that not every Israelite who was present at Sinai was aware of the magnitude of the moment, and, in fact, some even fell asleep. So it has become a tradition to hold a *tikkun leil* Shavuot, a night of study to repair for that falling asleep many year ago. We are fortunate to be the hosts this year of the North Fulton Reform Community Shavuot celebration. Joined by Temple Emanu-El, Temple Kehillat Chaim, and Temple Beth Tikvah, we will gather at CDT on the night of June 8th for services, ice cream and cheesecake (Shavuot also has the custom of eating dairy foods), and study. While we will not go all night, I will be joined by the Rabbis, Cantor, and Cantorial Soloist of all the congregations in offering a wide variety of learning opportunities following our service.

I hope this time of counting the *omer* brings blessings to you and all in your immediate circle, and I hope you will join us on June 8th for a fantastic night of prayer, study, and community as we celebrate receiving the Torah together.

Among our family and dearest friends, we welcomed a lovely non-Jewish couple who my mom recently met at her yoga studio. When my mom asked if they could join us, Wendy and I didn't hesitate with our response – of course. Besides enjoying their company, we saw this as one way to share our traditions with others, to bring people of different faiths together to learn about and celebrate our rituals. With news of another shooting at a place of worship, this time at Chabad in Poway, CA as they concluded their Passover week, I continue to realize just how important it is for each of us to do our part (even in small

ways) to inspire love and peace in order to combat hatred and more antisemitism.

This year was indeed one of the most memorable Passover seders we've hosted at our home. Like usual, we welcomed family and friends, read from the Haggadah, and enjoyed a delicious meal. But this year felt a little more special because of those new friends who joined us for our seder. It triggered a memory for me of a Passover seder when I was just a teenager. It took me back to my freshman year of college at Northern Arizona University (Go Lumberjacks!). A family in Tucson invited my grandfather and me as guests to their home for Passover. We were treated as if we were lifelong friends, and that really made an impact on me. Fast forward to the early 2000s. My brother-in-law's parents invited my family into their home for many Passovers. Now it's our turn to host new friends. It's a complete cycle of giving, and it's a great feeling.

Shifting to some CDT business, next week is an important one for all of us. We are nearing the end of the fiscal calendar, and I hope each of you is planning to attend the annual CDT Congregational Meeting at the synagogue on Sunday May 5th from 9:30-11:30am. We will take a few minutes to reflect on the past year and look ahead to the next with equal excitement. Amidst many accomplishments to highlight, I am extremely proud to report that Art Criden, VP of Finance, will be presenting a balanced budget for the congregation.

Cantorial Soloist's Message

Shalom Chaveirm - Hello Friends,

Our tradition teaches us that after our ancestors were delivered from Egypt, they were led to Mt. Sinai, where they received the *Torah*. *Pesach*, which we have just celebrated, is the celebration of our deliverance and *Shavuot*, which is coming soon, is the celebration of our receiving the *Torah*. What then, about the time in between? What must have been going on in the hearts and minds of our ancestors as they wandered in the desert? How quickly did the realities of their newfound freedom begin to set in? Did they wonder what was in store form them? Did they realize that they were ill equipped to govern themselves after 400 years of slavery? Did they begin to wonder "besides to be free, is there something greater in store for us? For what purpose did Adonai set us free from bondage?"

Sometimes, we too may be wondering: "Where are we going? What purpose does this journey have for us? What next?" During this time between *Pesach* and *Shavuot*, these seven weeks, perhaps we have an opportunity to check the course of our spiritual lives. Are we heading in the right direction?

As it turns out, we know now that the exodus was only the beginning for our ancestors. They were freed in order to receive the *Torah*, and ultimately, to be delivered into a land of their own – Israel.

During this time *Pesach* and *Shavuot*, may all who are lost find their way, may those who know where they are be strengthened, and may all of our paths lead to peace.
