## Rabbinic Reflections



Dear friends,

As we enter into May, we are in the midst of the portion of the Hebrew calendar called the *omer*. This period marks the 7 week (or 49 days) from leaving Egypt on Passover until receiving the Torah on Shavuot. Each day, our tradition says, we should count the days, adding value each day until we reach the spiritual peak of revelation at Sinai.

As I have been counting these days, I have also spent time remembering fondly the past programmatic year here at CDT. Last summer, we, as a community, embarked on a fantastic journey of *Chai for Chai*. These 18 events spread over the year were designed to give our entire community the opportunity to celebrate 18 years of Dor Tamid. From Rosh Hashanah services to the Purim spiel, and from concerts led by our Cantorial Soloist Mike Zuspan and his wife Amy to the recently held gala fundraiser, we truly celebrated this milestone in our community together. Each one of these 18 events was special in its own way—we prayed together, laughed together, sang together, and learned of our history together. 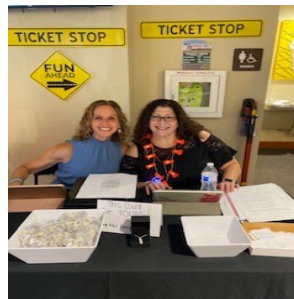




