Dear friends,

Three years ago, as we gathered to welcome in the New Year on *Erev Rosh Hashanah*, I spoke the following words:

"We may not know what the future brings, but we have the opportunity, through repentance, prayer, and charity to better ourselves. We have the opportunity, during these Holy Days, to examine our own personal relationship, and to try and improve how we relate to ourselves in the year to come."

What was an innocent phrase to begin wrapping up my sermon that evening, turned out to be something much more profound. We truly did not know what the future would be bringing us, just a few months later, as the COVID-19 pandemic reached our community. But not only did we not know what the future would bring, we were forced, by those days and weeks of solitude and quarantine, to examine our relationship with ourselves and one another.

That was three years ago, and our perspectives on the world have been changed in many ways. We have, as a community, grown in so many ways because of the strain that COVID put on each one of us and, as evidenced by the sheer number of people participating in recent events, services, and programs, has led us to a renewed commitment across our congregational family during this celebration of our 18th year as a congregation.




I look forward to seeing you all here at CDT!






