Dear friends,

As we enter in this month of September, we are right on the cusp of welcoming in the new year of 5784. As such, we will have the opportunity to gather together in just a couple of weeks to hear the *shofar*, sing *Avinu Malkeinu*, and work on the process of *cheshbon hanefesh* (the accounting of our souls). Then, just ten days later, we will gather again to hear the beautiful music and words of *Kol Nidre* and to give an accounting of our sins. The High Holy Days are truly an opportunity to reflect on who we are as individuals and as members of a community as we make a turn into the new year. And, not only that, they are a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with our community and our members who we may not have seen in a while.

But the High Holy Days do not begin with Rosh Hashanah. We have already begun preparing for the holy days as we have been hearing the *shofar* during this Hebrew month of Elul and on Saturday, September 9, we will have a wonderful opportunity to officially begin the cycle of *t'shuvah* with our annual service of *Selichot*.

This service, which is brief, helps us dive into the holy days and the ideas of repentance as we hear the words and melodies that are so familiar from Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. In addition, we will hear the blast of the *shofar* and change the Torah scrolls into their white garments for the Days of Awe.

Over the past few years, a small group, led by Bonnie and Ron Harvey, have been working to create these new covers, which are beautiful. So, we will gather at 7:00pm for an opportunity to meet the artist, Cecile Batchelor, who has worked with Bonnie and Ron to create these pieces of art that will adorn our ark during the upcoming season. And of course, there will be delicious charcuterie to enjoy as well followed by the service at 8:00pm. Also, a sincere thank you to the Harvey's for their generous donation of these new covers that will beautify our worship for years to come.

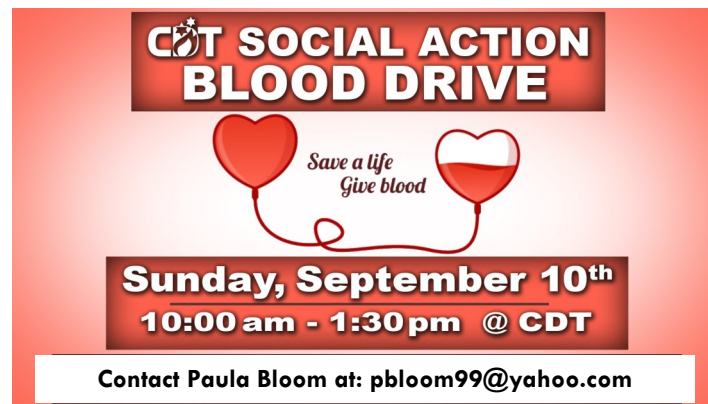


