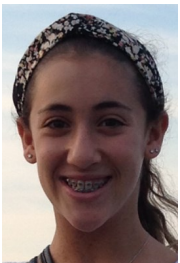

I, the undersigned, acting on the express instructions of the people whose names and addresses are attached to this bill of sale (and added to it prior to April, 22, 2016 at 10AM), do hereby sell all the leavened products forbidden to Jewish people on the Passover holiday still in the possession of those people to **Glen Gillingham** for the price of \$1,000,000,000.00, which sale is to be deemed immediately effective upon the down payment of no less than \$1.00. Should the balance not be paid in its entirety by Saturday evening, April 30, 2015, at 8:38 PM, the entire sale is to be declared invalid, whereupon the aforementioned leavened products will revert to the ownership of their original owners.

In accordance with Jewish law, I have transferred the goods referred to above to the purchaser by means of the commercial device current within Jewish circles called *kinyan sudar*, whereby the purchaser signals his acceptance of the terms of the agreement and takes possession of the goods in question by tugging on a handkerchief in the presence of witnesses.

Furthermore, this sale includes leavened products known to the sellers at the time of the sale, but also all leavened products present on their property or in their homes, places of business, or vehicles not specifically known to them. There are no exceptions to this: all leavened property is included.

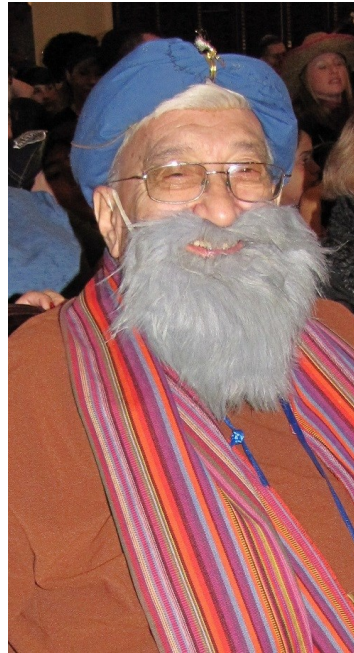

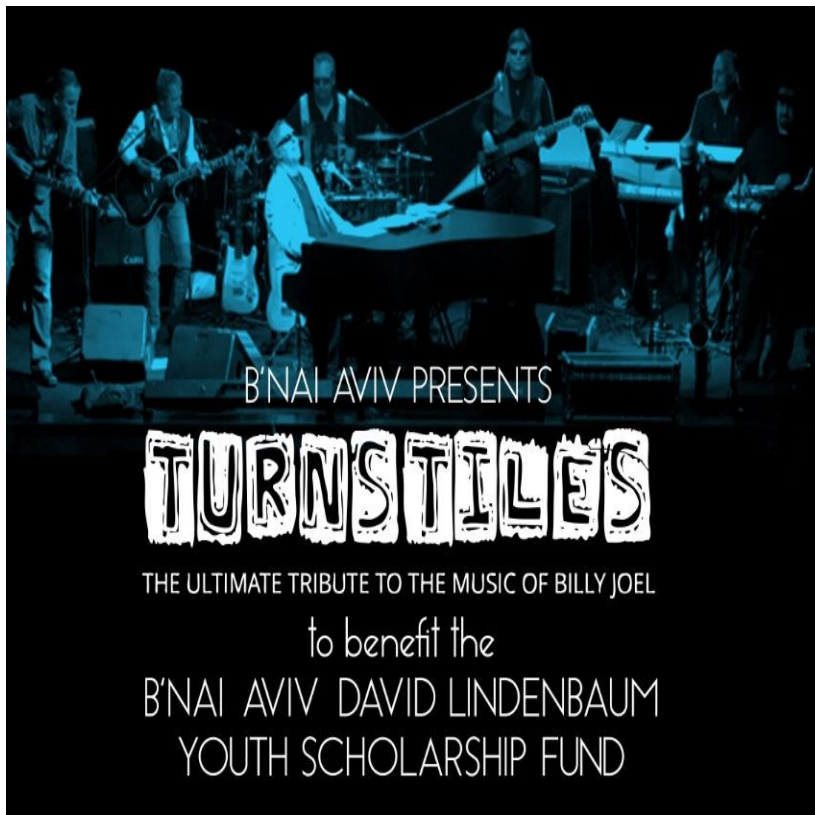

The Yellow Candle was created to keep alive the memory of the Six Million who perished in the Shoah. It was originally modeled after a traditional Jewish memorial Yahrzeit candle that burns 24 hours during periods of mourning and on the Yahrzeit anniversary of a family member. Its yellow wax serves to remind us of the yellow arm band which Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime. A photo on the candle container shows young people visiting Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. *This reflects the importance of teaching our youth the lessons of the Holocaust and of remembering the Six Million.*

All Yellow Candles will be available for pick up at B'nai Aviv throughout the week of 4/4. Please ensure you stop by and pick yours up so you can join the entire congregation in remembering the Six Million by lighting in your home Erev Yom HaShoah (5/4/16). We will light our Yellow Candle and display in a window so that the world can see...and so that they do not forget!

If you have a personal interest in enhancing the B'nai Aviv experience for future generations, a planned bequest in your Will is something you should think about. When you want to reduce or even eliminate your final income taxes a well planned charitable bequest is ideal. You can make a gift in your Will, maintain financial security during life and disinherit the taxman.

Gifts by Will are becoming more popular, and we hope that an increasing number of people will include B'nai Aviv as a beneficiary. Giving a gift of life insurance is a wonderful way to show you care. This type of gift often allows a person of modest means to make a donation much larger than they might have been able to make during their lifetime. Instead of contributing annually to B'nai Aviv, a donor directs funds to insurance premiums. As such you would receive a charitable receipt for each premium payment made. A gift of this type generates immediate and future tax relief for a donor and does not diminish your estate.
