

From the desk of Eliot Tillinger... Religious School Director

When you think of parent involvement, do you picture moms and dads volunteering in classrooms? That's one way to help, but research has shown that supporting your child's education at home is even more important. Here are conversation starters that will help you stay involved.

"Tell me what you did in class today."

Ask about what they are learning and how they are doing. You could remark on the current holiday or Israel project, for instance. ("I'm pleased to see how much you know about our people's history!")

"Tell me what your teacher did in class today."

It's your child's place to do their classwork, but you play a role too. Make sure they know what they're supposed to do by having them explain the assignments to you.

"Describe a book event or musical activity you enjoyed today."

This gives you an idea of what our children prefer to read. Encourage reading and listening skills by reading aloud, followed by them reading Hebrew aloud to you; this strengthens their retention of taught lessons.

"Tell me about what you learned that you'd like to know more about."

Use interests as jumping-off points for discussions. If children love talking about our Jewish holidays, you can reinforce learned lessons by having them "teach" you about the meaning and observances of the holiday. If they are fascinated by Tefillah (prayer), take them along to Shabbat service on Friday night or Saturday morning and further enlighten and enhance their comfort participating in services together; it's a wonderful and meaningful family bonding experience for all.

The past weeks were wonderful with religious school students decorating Purim masks, making their own Megillah scrolls, bejeweled crowns, groggers and of course handmade hamantaschen (hopefully at least one made it home intact for parents to taste!).

All students celebrated Passover by participating in Pesach Seders with genuinely set Seder tables and complete Haggadahs in a very realistic setting. These wonderful events create lifelong memories which will be fondly recalled each year as the holidays approach.


