From the desk of Liz Singer... Director of Life Long Learning

I am so excited to have found a home here at B'nai Aviv. I look forward to sharing my passion for Judaism, as well as learning and praying alongside all of you. Judaism has so many facets, and I see my position as pinpointing what makes each individual, child and adult, light up Jewishly. It might be students cooking alongside members of sisterhood, it may be hearing different voices share opinions and commentary on the texts, it might also be having a day of immersing oneself in learning about a holiday. There really is something

within our culture that will reach everyone. I am looking forward to working with lay leaders to build diverse and inspiring programming.

In an effort to begin to address this, one of my first tasks is assessing the religious school and augmenting it with additional lessons and programming.

Some of the changes that will be implemented this year are the following:

- Learning goals will be established so there is more of a definitive separation between grades and subject matter.
- Religious schools spend a lot of time on Genesis and Exodus, and tend to ignore the remaining three books of the Torah. To address this, age-appropriate ways to teach the bible in its entirety will be introduced in the classroom.
- Hebrew will be separated by level, so that students who need enrichment, and students who need supplemental help, have that opportunity.
- Hebrew reading will be reinforced with games that teach students modern vocabulary.
- Students will be divided into upper and lower grades for communal prayer. It is in this environment that we will focus on the meaning of the prayer and explore it through relevant stories, discussions and activities.
- Mindfulness is a trendy term but it is something that Jews have been doing as part of the *mussar* movement for centuries. In the religious school environment this can be introduced through blessings, and focusing on a *middah* (value) of the month. Values are the most transferable skill that we can teach students. It is a subject that they are most likely to see the adults in their lives demonstrate, so why not highlight it in a Jewish context. This will include stories, conversations and an activities that demonstrate the highlighted value within the community.
- There will be a more holistic approach to the holidays; there is so much more to learn and too frequently we focus only on the story and customs that are most commonly practiced. What is the history of the holiday? Do they celebrate it differently in other countries? What are the laws of the holiday? And finally, what questions are answered by the commentaries that we aren't even thinking to ask?

My philosophy of religious education: how a student views their identity and Judaism as a whole, is largely grounded in their educational experiences. It seems simple. If children have a positive experience in religious school, and we do our job in ensuring they foster a love of learning, they will want to continue to be involved and affiliated through adulthood. This makes the role of the religious school even more profound because of the implications when the reverse happens. The relationship must be one of partnership between the home and the synagogue.

I look forward to working together and finding ways to create more meaningful Jewish moments for you and your family.
