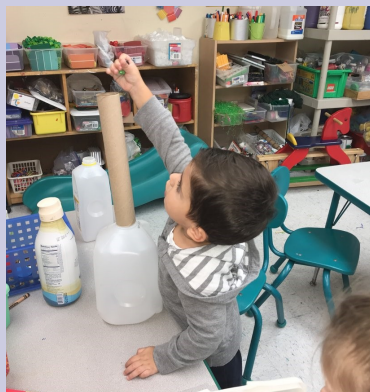
From the desk of... Mindy Bernstein, ECEC Director

The B'nai Aviv Early Childhood Education Center emphasizes the process rather than the product. This means that there is more than one way to do a project and there is no "right" or "wrong" way to create something. Mostly, it means that the end result is not

the important part of anything we do. The "PERFECT" project is a thing of the past. We want children to create and experience everything in their own way.

One of our favorite paths to creation is through loose parts learning. Architect Simon Nicolson developed the Theory of Loose Parts in 1972. In his original paper on the subject he wrote, "In any environment, both the degree of inventiveness and creativity, and the possibility of discovery, are directly proportional to the number and kind of variables in it."

Our children love loose parts! Our recycling art and science "collection" room is filled with natural items big and small that we use. The children love going to the room to pick out what they want for whatever exploration the class is working on. We created Chanukiahs, Torahs, and Tu B'Shevat trees all made completely of loose, recycled and repurposed materials. Kids are open to experimenting and the results are always different and always awesome. The kids



are proud of their work because it is their work. This is what early childhood education is all about.

Guided by loving teachers and an amazing staff, our ECEC program is an amazing place for kids to learn and grow. Kids explore the world around them, make friends and learn about being a part of a Jewish community. In March we will open registration for the 2019/2020 school year.

Registration for the 2019 Summer Camp season has begun! New specialty camps are available this year - B'nai Girls and our Teen Travel Day Camp. Have you secured a place for your child yet

while the early bird fee is still available? If not, please contact me at 954-384-6605.

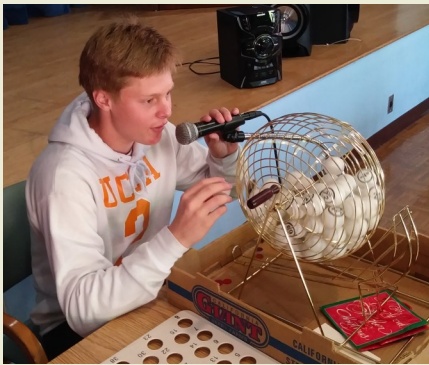
