





Alan Dershowitz

Professor Alan M. Dershowitz is a Brooklyn native who has been called "the best known criminal lawyer in the world" and one of the "most distinguished defenders of indivi rights". Dershowitz, a graduate of Brooklyn College and Yale Law School, joined the Harvard Law School faculty at age 25 (the youngest in the school's history). He became a Felix Frankfurtur Professor of Law Emeritus professor after 50 years of teaching and over 10,000 students.

Dershowitz has been called the "winningest" criminal lawyer in modern history and has argued hundreds of appeals in courts throughout the nation. As a lawyer, he has won the vast majority of his homicide cases and has never lost a client to the death penalty. In addition to over 1000 news and magazine articles worldwide, he has authored 30 books, including The New York Times #1 bestseller Chutzpoh. He has been named America's most "public Jewish Defender" and "the Jewish state's lead attorney in the court of public opinion."
