From the Desk of Rabbi Adam Watstein

B'nai Aviv is not a 7-11 Synagogue

In 1995, Rabbi Michael Goldberg scathingly wrote that "some synagogues are like "religious 7-11s." When American Jews get a craving for something sweet and gooey -- a bar or bat mitzvah, a wedding, a

baby naming -- they drop in, plunk down their money, savor the choice, and then drive away, until the craving overcomes them again. The "members" of such synagogues are essentially nothing more than consumers....And the rabbi? He takes the role of counter help whose job it is to keep the individual customers satisfied so they keep coming back to this particular franchise outlet rather than that other Stop 'N Shop down the street."

B'nai Aviv is not this type of synagogue. B'nai Aviv is our collective refusal to accept Rabbi Goldberg's indictment of the Jewish community; that a synagogue is nothing more than a life-cycle factory.

I have no doubt that such institutions exist, populated by Jews who have, for a variety of historical and sociological reasons, come to misunderstand Jewish Identity as some type of ala carte menu. For these "consumers," Jewish Identity has become a novelty item purchased only when needed, and as the years and generations pass, it seems that for many, Judaism is being left on the shelf altogether.

Just the other day, my colleague sat with a Jewish man long separated from Yiddishkeit. As they spoke, the man admitted that he and his wife never affiliated with a synagogue, nor did they bother to provide their children with a Jewish education. Fearing the rabbi's impression, the man abruptly reached for a black and white photo poised on the mantle and boasted, "But my father was adamant about being buried in his Tallis. This is a picture of him wearing that same Tallis during what must be some kind of Hebrew School graduation. The whole family is there and dressed so nicely!" My colleague kept his composure, holding back the tears caused by the fact that this man could not recognize that he was holding his father's Bar Mitzvah picture.

Sadly, the above story, though extreme, is the possible generational consequence of "7-11 Judaism." For Rabbi Goldberg to label synagogue members "consumers" is to suggest that their only interest and appetite for Judaism is related to the present... that they are buying a Jewish experience to be enjoyed in real time only. Thankfully, this is not B'nai Aviv. Affiliation with a synagogue has very little to do with the present, in my opinion. To be a member of a synagogue is to be part of a 3000 year story, and the "fee" we pay (what instigates Goldberg's consumer analogy is not a "fee" at all, but rather simultaneously a debt we owe to the past and also an investment for the future.

In the 12th century, the famous rabbinic and medical scholar, Moses Ben Maimon (**Rambam/Maimonides**) noted in his philosophical treatise *Guide for the Perplexed*, that any lasting transformation or influence on human character happens

gradually. While awe-inspiring moments may momentarily shake human soul, they cannot themselves effect a perpetual shift in character. This is referred to as *the inevitability of gradualness*." For Judaism to have an impact on our identity, it must be incorporated into our life routine, not sought out once or twice a year. Jewish Identity itself must be a habit. As I've said often from the bima, "Being Jewish Requires Doing Jewish." It is in this way that B'nai Aviv collectively refuses to accept Rabbi Goldberg's indictment of the Jewish community:

- * Our daily minyan not only thrives, but is comprised mostly of men and women NOT SAYING Kaddish, and instead attend to support the endeavor so it's there for those when they need it.
- * Shabbat services continue to be well attended by those interested in strengthening a relationship to G-d, Torah and Jewish learning, not just to experience a life cycle event. Our stable of readers on "Team Torah" has increased, as has the number of parents volunteering to read Torah at their children's Bar/Bat Mitzvah.
- * The events of our auxiliary groups (Men's Club, Sisterhood, Hazak, etc.) are frequent and popular, giving people plenty of reasons to be involved in Jewish life other than a life cycle event.
- * Our youth group, led by Todd Morchelies, remains the most active in the southeastern part of the United States. Our Hebrew High School has nearly 40 students enrolled in its inaugural year. In short, our children are engaging Judaism long after Bar/Bat Mitzvah.
- * Our Social Action endeavors, from monthly sandwich making for the hungry to the annual calendar of our 50+family **Kehillah Club** to our **upcoming community Mitzvah Day**, testify to the fact that B'nai Aviv is committed to Tikkun Olam, one mitzvah at a time.
- * Torah Talk on Wednesdays continues to be an excuse for 60-80 adults to study Torah on a weekly basis, and our extensive calendar of adult education opportunities includes scholar in residence lectures, multi-class seminars, Hebrew enrichment, an adult Bar/Bat mitvah program, and more!

The above list continues, but I would like to do better. Together, we can ensure that B'nai Aviv grows to be a national model for Jewish community building. By continuing to be a Jewish institution that is part of our routine and habit, and not something we think about or engage once or twice a year, we collectively refuse to accept Rabbi Goldberg's indictment of the Jewish community.







JTS Announces New Phase of Major Multi-Year Reinvestment in Morningside Heights Campus



Newly Closed Sale Offers Opportunity for Redesign Focused on Students and Community

FEBRUARY 1, 2016, NEW YORK, NY

The Jewish Theological Seminary (JTS), one of the leading Jewish institutions in North America, today took a major step to redesign its storied and historic campus in Morningside Heights, New York. JTS completed the sale of a defined lot of land at the eastern edge of its campus at 3080 Broadway, limited rights to develop that land, and one of its off-campus residence halls to Savanna, a New York-based real estate investment and development firm. Today, we’re reimagining our campus to meet the needs of current and future students and the broader Jewish community,” said Arnold Eisen, chancellor of JTS. “We will use advanced technology and design to strengthen our academic institution at a time of rapid and radical transformation. Our new campus will facilitate a deeper collaboration with our neighbors, our city, and with individuals and communities around the world. It will provide multiple new opportunities for dialogue around the most critical issues of our time. This is the beginning of a new chapter in our long history as a world class educational institution, dedicated to training the leaders of tomorrow.”

The redevelopment of JTS will include: a new library to hold its unparalleled collection of Judaica treasures, a state of the art residence hall, improved conference facilities, and an auditorium/performing arts space with advanced technological capacity. Together, these facilities will enable JTS to provide a 21st century education for its students and to project its vision and teaching throughout North America and the world.

"We are thrilled to take on this most important and challenging project for JTS," said Tod Williams and Billie Tsien. "This new building will help the campus to engage the world, honoring the institution's past and celebrating what is to come. As architects our task is to create a vessel that will change the lives of those who experience it and ultimately make life itself more meaningful. We are very excited and honored to be working with the board, administration, faculty and staff at JTS towards this common goal."

Savanna has hired Beyer Blinder Belle Architects, recognized for its stewardship of historic buildings in sensitive urban sites, to design a 250,000-sq.ft. residential development for the site on 122nd Street between Amsterdam Avenue and Broadway. Savanna has over two decades of experience investing in and developing properties throughout New York City.

Wills & Bequests

If you have a personal interest in enhancing the B'nai Aviv experience for future generations, a planned bequest in your Will is something you should think about. When you want to reduce or even eliminate your final income taxes a well planned charitable bequest is ideal. You can make a gift in your Will, maintain financial security during life and disinherit the taxman.

Gifts by Will are becoming more popular, and we hope that an increasing number of people will include B'nai Aviv as a beneficiary. It is one way to support B'nai Aviv when it might not be financially possible during your working or retirement years. A bequest is a revocable gift that can be amended at any time. Charitable gifts made in a Will are deemed made in the year of death. The charitable tax credit is therefore received by the estate and can offset any tax owing from the estate.

If you are about to draft a Will or make changes to your current Will, your lawyer can include a bequest to B'nai Aviv. You can leave a specific amount, a particular asset, a percentage of the value of your estate or the residue of your estate after all other bequests have been made.

The easiest and least expensive way to make a small change in your existing will is to add a codicil. The codicil will retain all the provisions of your will, except those which are modified by this addition. If you already have a will and are considering a bequest to B'nai Aviv, the addition of a codicil should be discussed with your lawyer.

Gifts of Life Insurance

A gift of life insurance presents you with an opportunity to make a significant future gift to benefit B'nai Aviv, while enjoying current and/or future tax savings. It is an economical way to give a larger and more lasting gift at a fraction of the ultimate value from disposable income. A gift of life insurance is also an ideal way for you to support a particular area of interest and/or program at B'nai Aviv, at a level that may not be possible by any other means.

Giving a gift of life insurance is a wonderful way to show you care. This type of gift often allows a person of modest means to make a donation much larger than they might have been able to make during their lifetime. Instead of contributing annually to B'nai Aviv, a donor directs funds to insurance premiums. As such you would receive a charitable receipt for each premium payment made. A gift of this type generates immediate and future tax relief for a donor and does not diminish your estate.

You can also transfer ownership of an existing policy to B'nai Aviv. Donors considering the transfer of a life insurance policy should obtain professional advice concerning the income tax consequences of such a transfer.

You can take out a new policy, making B'nai Aviv the owner and/or beneficiary.
