From the desk of... Rabbi Adam Watstein

Sadly, I can't say the phone call was unexpected. Since January, there have been 90 bomb threats called into 54 JCCs in 27 states and a Canadian province. But by the time news of those 90 threats sounded as an alert on my IPhone, they were already determined non-credible. News is often, by definition, delivered after-the fact, which is why it was possible for any of us to scan through the visuals of those JCC evacuations. These were Jews, after all. Jews just like us...parents, children and elderly, and they were targeted for violence for no other reason than that they were Jews, which made those 90 bomb threats personal. Yet, by the time the stories reached us, we KNEW that the pho-

tos of preschoolers being marched away from buildings were already back in class and that the swimmers still dripping wet from a hasty exit were already back in the pool. Our reactions to incidents elsewhere have varied. Perhaps we were angry and emboldened, or perhaps, to the cheers of the perpetrators, stifled and intimidated. Our response, however, has been uniform. Every Jewish institution in the country has reviewed and bolstered its security protocols, procedures and policies...B'nai Aviv included. But today, it was my phone that rang, not someone's in North Carolina or Washington DC, and I began to understand a story I hadn't read in the papers or seen on the evening news.

We were told immediately the children were safe, evacuated from the Posnack Day School due to an unspecified threat. I knew it would be highly organized because my first grader had already told me about her class's special "fire drills," and I expected she would quickly be brought back to class. My wife and I reasoned it would be easy to explain away a few police cars and fire trucks as an "extra special fire drill." Then the second call came informing us the students had been evacuated to a local church and should be picked up.

"At least she is safe," we kept saying to each other, both silently knowing that wouldn't actually be true until she was with us, and, even then, that she wouldn't really ever be the same, and neither would we. The questions would come, and we would have to answer them:

- * Why did we need to walk so far away from school?
- * Why were so many police cars following us?
- * Why were news cameras filming us?
- * Why were there helicopters in the sky?
- * Are the bad people going to start a fire at my school again tomorrow?"


And perhaps that is the point of these 5 waves of bomb threats, none of which has proven to be credible. Thousands of us parents forced into conversations we aren't yet supposed to have with our children. In 8 weeks, children on

90 occasions have asked, "Are the bad people going to start a fire again at my school tomorrow?" If we emphatically answer "no" we are lying. It may, indeed, happen again tomorrow. But if we simply answer "yes," then we run the risk of scaring a generation away from Jewish Identity. Perhaps the point of these threats is to wear us all down. If venturing into a Jewish institution becomes synonymous with anxiety and the prospect of violence, then Jews will stop venturing into Jewish institutions. If that is the case, what type of Jewish community will my children inherit from me?

When we arrived, the older, taller students made it hard for my wife and I to spot our daughter at first. The threat occurred during morning prayers and many of the older boys were still wearing tefillin. What a sight. A half-mile from the Posnack campus in a church parking lot surrounded by armed officers and dozens of police vehicles and our kids were wearing tefillin! I quickly learned that several students had raced to the Aron Kodesh and removed the Torahs from the ark before being evacuated. Once safely in the parking lot, students rested a Torah on the hood of a car and finished reading this morning's portion. My daughter emerged from amongst this mass of older students, and she was smiling. She asked her questions, and we answered them as best we could. She admitted to being scared, and we told her that was ok. She asked if it could happen again, and we honestly said it could, but we also reminded her that being scared and being courageous were not necessarily two different things; that a Jew could be both. We pointed to the older students and reminded her that for 3000 years there have been groups of people who have tried to make being Jewish almost impossible, and that today was no different. Sometimes being Jewish is hard. Sometimes it is even scary, but being Jewish is having the courage to always take the Torah with you, just like the older students at Posnack. Her great-grandparents, survivors, were surely scared as they brought matzah home hidden in pillowcases just so they could have a taste of Pesach in the former Soviet Union. But they were equally courageous. Today, my daughter and all the other students at Posnack learned that even when groups of people try to make being Jewish impossible, when they try to intimidate and displace us, we must have the courage take Torah with us, even to a church parking lot surrounded by police. More questions may come in the morning, and I will answer them as best I can as I drive my daughter back to school.





From the desk of ...

If there's something I'm knowledgeable about, it's ... early childhood, I mean... children!

Children can be loud, noisy, messy. Yes they are, especially when they come to shul! So you are an adult who's waiting the whole week to come to shul to daven, listen to Rabbi's speech, socialize a little bit, eat a little bit of bagels and make lots of Lechaim. And here you are at shul, and there they come: The loud little kinderlech, that run, cry, drop the kipah, stand on the chairs, and more! And of course you get upset, sometimes with the child, and most of the times with the parents.

Yes, I totally get you. Let me tell you my story. I was a child who went to shul every week, at the beginning just to greet my grandparents and let my parents meet with their friends. I was bored, so I would run on the stairs, play hide and seek, tag. You name it, I did it. And when I wasn't that young anymore, the shul was the place where my friends were, so I wanted to go just to chat and wait for my family after the service. I recognized the shul as my place, because I got used to it. It was a familiar place and the place where I built my friendships, and later, the connection to my Jewish identity.

If anyone got annoyed at us running and not sitting for even a minute, I didn't know it. I don't recall that. I do, however, recall the songs, the books, the Rabbi, the chazzan while I was doing my noisy performance. And the shul grew on me. I wanted to go and be part of it, because that was the place where familiar faces, familiar chants, familiar walls had embraced me. And because I was that child, a culture of tolerance was planted in me. When I go to shul now, and the annoying little ones start to appear, I just wish for them to come more and more. I know that they will be ME in the future, and if I dare to push them away, they may not have what I have now: a love for Judaism and a commitment to perpetuate Judaism throughout the young generations.

I know that we all walk a fine line here. You want to daven, you want to listen to the Torah...and they just don't let you do that! So my question to you is: why do you daven, why do you listen to the parasha? Bottom line? You care about Judaism, you want to keep the Jewish traditions going, right?

I'm asking you to listen to my humble advice: Judaism starts right from the very beginning: our kinderlech. Show them what Torah teaches us: compassion, kindness-chesed, patience..... This is what our patriarchs did and this is what we do: teaching through actions, because this is the way our kids learn. And for you, a parent of this little devil who doesn't stop for a minute....keep trying, keep bringing your child to shul and help build a culture of tolerance where there's a wide spectrum of generations coexisting and sharing a common goal: celebrating Judaism. We will all be better for it.
