As I look at the calendar, I see that my 2 favorite holidays have come or are coming- they are the 2 Ps-Purim and Pesach. So why are they my favorites?

As a child, I vividly remember the excitement of the Purim Carnival in my synagogue. We got to "dress-up" like the other kids did on October 31st, made really loud noise in synagogue (which was always forbidden) and ate Hamantashean (apricot was my favorite). My Mom (z"l) and brother would help me create a costume that was made of things lying around the house-I even remember having a huge box turned into a dreidel and I won the "best costume" award. Children who never attended services would come to the carnival-it was fun, unique and a time for families to be together.

Passover also provided some great memories. My Dad(z"l) , Mom(z"l) brother and I would schlep Passover dishes up from our basement (that's a lower level for you

Floridians) where they were stored all year long and move all the non Passover things away for the duration of the holiday. The house was cleaned from top to bottom. Some relatives had a special Passover kitchen and didn't have to move pots, pans, dishes, etc.- after my 10 plus trips up and down the stairs schlepping things, I wished I lived with them! The Seders were my favorite time-masterfully lead by my Grandpa(z"l)- we had great food, all the family together and I used my Hagadah that had stains of spilled wine from years past.

Are we creating the same or similar memories for our children and grandchildren? Are we connecting with our past and our traditions? Do we take the time to "do Jewish" in our daily lives so that we connect from one generation to the next? At B'nai Aviv we give you all the opportunities to connect your past with our collective futures. It isn't easy to unplug from our daily grind, but I promise you that your children and grandchildren will one day reminisce about the crazy costume they wore at Purim or the excitement of looking for the afikomen-they may even use the Hagadah from their childhood or the matzah cover from generations before..

I wish for you and your families the blessing of being together at home or in our synagogue for Shabbat, Holidays or just plain fun.

Remember, YOU belong here!

Teachers incorporate children's interests into each classroom, and seamlessly weave Judaic learning into the daily activities of each class.

Because this is the time for registration and re-registration for preschool programs for the 2018/2019 school year, the questions always arise as to how academic a program should be. However, as I walk around the school and spend time with the children each day, I feel that the most important job we have is helping the development of the socialization skills of our children to achieve their academic success. Through the hallways and classrooms you will see happy children singing, playing and learning.

A sense of real community is built as our younger, and older, children build relationships through the years. The sense of community that begins in the pre-school extends far beyond that, into the life of the classroom and our synagogue. Family members are welcome volunteers in every classroom. Our students and their families enjoy taking part in preschool holiday celebrations, as well as enjoying community service projects and holiday celebrations within the wider Temple B'nai Aviv community.

We recently celebrated Purim, or the Feast of Lots, a joyous holiday that recounts the saving of the Jewish people from a threatened massacre during the Persian period. It did take a village to prepare our Purim festivities. Our parents along with grandparents and children helped make 750 hamentaschen together. The children paraded around in their Purim costumes and learned all about Tzedakkah and Purim.

We are embarking on our next journey-enhancing our preschool and starting our first steps to building a state of the art preschool and religious school facility. It will take our entire Kehillah community to accomplish this goal!

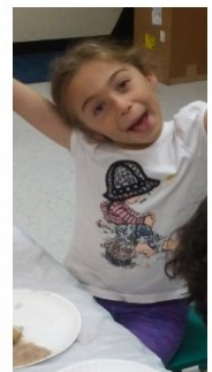
