Children who never attended services would come to the carnival-it was fun, unique and a time for families to be together.

Passover also provided some great memories. My Dad(z"l), Mom(z"l) brother and I would schlep Passover dishes up from our basement (that's a lower level for you

Floridians) where they were stored all year long and move all the non Passover things away for the duration of the holiday. The house was cleaned from top to bottom. Some relatives had a special Passover kitchen and didn't have to move pots, pans, dishes, etc.- after my 10 plus trips up and down the stairs schlepping things, I wished I lived with them! The Seders were my favorite time-masterfully lead by my Grandpa(z"l)- we had great food, all the family together and I used my Hagadah that had stains of spilled wine from years past.

Are we creating the same or similar memories for our children and grandchildren? Are we connecting with our past and our traditions? Do we take the time to "do Jewish" in our daily lives so that we connect from one generation to the next? At B'nai Aviv we give you all the opportunities to connect your past with our collective futures. It isn't easy to unplug from our daily grind, but I promise you that your children and grandchildren will one day reminisce about the crazy costume they wore at Purim or the excitement of looking for the afikomen-they may even use the Hagadah from their childhood or the matzah cover from generations before..

I wish for you and your families the blessing of being together at home or in our synagogue for Shabbat, Holidays or just plain fun.
