


From the desk of... Mindy Bernstein, ECEC Director

Life's first teachers are parents *horim* (parents in Hebrew) and preschool teachers *morah* (teacher in Hebrew). Parents and

teachers are partners in education. "Who is wise?" asks Ben Zoma who then answered "the one who learns from everyone." When educators and parents work together as partners, they create important opportunities for children to develop social, emotional, and academic competencies. Teachers and parents provide a vital support system to help students flourish.

Both groups are important. Research has found that a positive, effective relationship between parents and teachers



The month of March also brings Purim. We will learn about Purim and explore the different sounds of Purim; hearing the Megillat Esther (Story of Esther/Purim) and the sound of groggers (noisemakers). We will see and observe the bright costumes and the Hebrew writing in the megillah scroll. We will feel and touch the texture of the parchment used to make the megillah scroll and the dough for the hamantashen. And we will



smell and taste the hamantashen baking and different fillings we use. The children will also learn about giving tzedakah (charity) to help our neighbors and have a chance to make their own their own mishloach manot. The PTO and our staff will work together to give the children a well-rounded experience with our hamantaschen baking, Purim parade and our Purim carnival.

There were three different rotations for each class to explore the prayer. In one exercise they had a positivity circle where everyone shared positive things about each other, to help recognize that G-d created us and our

talents. In another exercise students put together an Aleinu puzzle of the English translation of the prayer and then answered questions about the meaning. And finally students pretended that they were working in a PR Firm and had to create a campaign advertising the different qualities of G-d. They had the option to create commercials, design t-shirts or create print ads.

The volunteer group, Kehillah Club, had a great time playing Bingo with seniors at the Daniel Cantor Senior Center. We also participated in Field Day, which was organized in conjunction with the Special Olympics. Participants played games and competed as a team while making new friends.

Adult Education programming has been very busy. Seven individuals have been very committed to learning every Thursday preparing for their Adult B'nai Mitzvah which will be held in 2020. The group has become very cohesive, and it makes learning together even more meaningful. They just completed a unit exploring various Rites of Passage, why Jews participate in these customs, and how they have evolved over time.

Progressive Day of Learning was very successful with sessions addressing the topics of Jewish parenting, prayer, technology, and influential Jews. The final session was an Ask the Rabbi featuring Rabbi Watstein and Rabbi Epelbaum. Everyone learned a lot, and it affirmed how many talented educators we have at B'nai Aviv.


