When things are good, how do we appreciate them? With words of thanks! Perhaps even a prayer! Through the act of Tikkun Olam – fixing the world. We say a prayer of gratitude “Modeh/Modah Ani” – “I give thanks...”

Our Early Childhood Education Center has more classes, more children, Mommy and Me program, updated curriculum and a new library. What a great way to start off our New Year!

I hope all of you and your families, and friends, enjoy a Shanah Tovah U’Metukah – a good and sweet year...all year!

## From the desk of... Liz Singer, Director of Life Long Learning

The Religious School was so lucky to have a full month of Religious School classes before the High Holidays rolled in. This gave students time to learn prayers and review materials that they may have forgotten over the summer. There has been a lot of action happening both in the classrooms and in the school. Some examples of this can be found in our youngest grades: Kindergarten and First Grade.

Kindergarten has been learning their Hebrew letters and is almost half way through the *alef bet*. With each letter they learn they add vocabulary to their growing list. Students have even begun to answer their teacher, Morah Zena, in Hebrew “po or lo po” when she takes attendance. They have also been learning about what the word “reflection” means. For the new year, 5780, the class decorated a mirror with reminders of how they can do better in the future. The class was paired with their 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade chavrutas/buddies. Students were very excited to receive cards from their new friends and together everyone made honey pots.

First Grade has been learning about what the word “slichah” means. One class had fun playing tag so they could practice saying the new word. They also began working on one of their Judaic “artifacts”, the Shabbat box. Throughout the year they will be creating more items to fill this box including a Kiddush cup, candlesticks and a challah cover. These will be used at various Shabbat events throughout the year.

For the first time ever the Religious School students hosted their parents in the classrooms. This Open House is a new tradition that ended up being so popular that many parents requested it be held a second time this year. Parents had the opportunity to meet both teachers and each other. It also offered students the opportunity to show parents everything that they have been working on during the month. The bulletin boards were full of hard work that the classes contributed.

The September Shabbos Squad had great attendance. Everyone had a lot of fun participating in a relay race with fruit. What does this have to do with praying? Well in the Torah portion Ki Tavo the Israelites carried their produce offerings to the temple in very strange ways, and this is what we all experienced.

Adult Education began the year with the first installment of the College Preparedness Series. Rebekah Schulze, EdD, Founder of Pathways College Counseling, offered the group a lot of very important information and things to consider as one begins the college application process. The next installment will be November 19<sup>th</sup>, featuring Seth Lubin as he discusses Jewish life once a student arrives on campus.

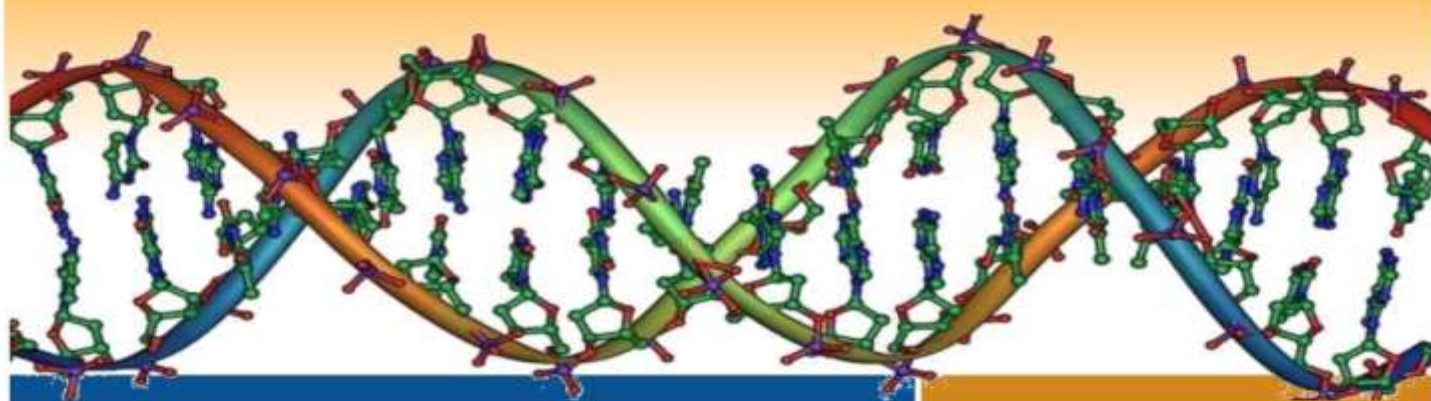

# Jewish Medical Ethics: A 21st Century Discussion



Within the field of ethics, one of the most challenging frontiers is medical ethics. While contemporary medical knowledge preserves life, modern advances have raised moral and ethical dilemmas related to the sanctity and dignity of life – issues whose scope was unimaginable a generation ago.

A new ten-lesson Melton course on Jewish Medical Ethics explores what Judaism has to say on a number of challenging issues, including human and animal cloning, surrogate motherhood and multiple parents, genetic identity, and assisted suicide/aid in dying.

Author Rabbi Dr. Elliot Dorff is a world-renowned expert on medical ethics and Professor of Jewish Philosophy at American Jewish University. He is the author of thirteen books including: *Matters of Life and Death: A Jewish Approach to Modern Medical Ethics* (Jewish Publication Society, 1998), and co-editor of twelve books including *The Oxford Handbook of Jewish Ethics and Morality* (Oxford University Press, 2013) and *Contemporary Jewish Ethics and Morality: A Reader* (Oxford University Press, 1995).
