Dear Parents,

Following this letter, you will find the registration packet for the 2018-19 school year.

This year, students in grades 4-7 will have choices of different subjects in Judaics. Hebrew will be for grades 4-7 only and in small groups of 4-6 students. **All** classes are first-come first-served and capped at a given number of students so please make sure to get your financial affairs in order so that you may register on time!

Registration begins on **Sunday, March 25!** *Please read the accompanying explanations and guidelines carefully*, to familiarize yourselves with the registration process; and complete the paperwork.

Finances

The financial portion of the process is totally separate from registration itself. Please note the instructions that follow.

- In order to register for Religious School, you must be current in all of your Temple financial obligations, including this year's school fees, and the minimum payment for next year's fees listed below.**
- At any time between now and March 21 at 3:00 p.m., contact Pam Fells, TKE accountant (770/973-3533 X224) to confirm that you are current with financial matters and *make the minimum payment*. Pam will give you a unique Registration Code, to be listed on each page of your school registration papers. **No school paperwork will be accepted without that code number on March 25 or any time thereafter.**

Guidelines for payment

- Two of nine equal payments of the total school fees are due to obtain your registration code.
- Please provide a credit card to the accountant that can be used to automatically charge the remaining 7 monthly payments, starting September 15.**
- Exception: if your child is celebrating a bar/bat mitzvah prior to November 1, all fees must be paid in full by the start of the school year.
- Members who join TKE after the start of the school year but during August-October will pay standard school fees. Those members who join in November or later will pay on a pro-rated standard fee schedule, based on date of joining.
- If your child is a new 5th to 7th grade student and has never been to Hebrew School before, there is an additional \$300 fee per child for more individualized Hebrew tutoring.

Course Descriptions

Grades PreK and K

Our youngest students learn about Torah, Holidays, and the synagogue through stories, crafts, music, and movement.

Grades 1 through 3:

Kamp Kol Emeth! For grades 1-3, we are bringing all the things we love about camp to Sunday mornings! Students will have warm and caring counselors to play games, do community building activities, and facilitate reflections on the experiences and learning they encounter as they move through “specials,” including Hebrew language through movement, holidays, art, Torah, music and tefillah. The first grade will be together in one “cabin.” There will be three mixed grade cabins of second and third graders. On the “Class Selection” form in this packet, second and third graders may request up to three other children as cabin-mates and we will do our best to honor at least one request for each child.

Grades 4 and 5: The students in grades 4 and 5 will choose from 3 tracks for Judaics – on a first-come first-served basis.

Art - Students will study Torah stories and demonstrate their understanding and ideas about the stories through visual art. This class is appropriate for 5th graders who took the art track in the 2017-2018 school year as the topic is different.

Building Torah- Students will explore stories from the Tanach (Bible) and will use Legos and other building materials to connect with the stories and some of the deeper teachings building activities. Activities will also foster overarching biblical values such as treating each other with respect and working cooperatively.

Israel – Built around the idea that a strong connection to and knowledge of Israel, independent of the Arab-Israeli conflict, is an important component of Jewish identity in the 21st century, this track will explore Jewish connection to the land of Israel, people, places, culture, state-building and more – in an engaging style through art, role play, debates, simulations, and projects. After taking this course in 5th grade, TKE student Matthew Worly said that one of the reasons he enjoyed it is that the teacher “didn’t just tell us things. We got to actually DO things.”

Grades 6 and 7: Students in grades 6 & 7 will choose from three tracks for Judaics – on a first-come first-served basis.

All-In – This classroom will be home to a variety of containers, each “all-in” with 8-13 items that illustrate a different theme. In groups of 4-6, learners will crack codes and solve problems to be able to access videos, articles, websites, people and more with the ultimate goal of discovering each container’s unstated theme, which will be a Jewish value reflected by a traditional or modern text.

Siddur Creation - Students will engage with the themes of the key prayers of the Jewish worship service and express them through their own poetry, drawings, and narrative writing. They will work as a class to choose a variety of their work to compile into a siddur (prayerbook) to be used in religious school or family services. In this class, students will come to understand the key themes of a portion of our liturgy, develop a personal relationship with prayer, and express their creativity, all while developing a lasting product for use in our community. You can find the siddur that was created by our 2016-17 sixth grade in the back of the sanctuary if you would like to see an example of the thoughtful and sacred work created by our students taking this course.

Middot (Values) – From August through late March, students will explore a variety of Jewish values and virtues and how they can live those values in their daily lives. These may include Jewish teachings on care and protection of the earth and animals, caring for the sick, honoring the elderly, loving your neighbor as yourself, judging others favorably, being a good friend, and more. This class will take 3-4 field trips to do social action/community service that puts some of these values into action. On field trip dates, class may be extended to 8:45 a.m. to 1 p.m., as needed. Beginning in late March, students will spend five sessions learning from the Sacred Choices curriculum. Sacred Choices is the Union For Reform Judaism’s curriculum about adolescent relationships and sexual ethics. Topics covered in the middle school module of this curriculum include communication and assertiveness, self-worth, self-control, peer pressure and treating others with respect in friendships and dating relationships.

Grades 8 and 9, Sundays at 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.

Beit Noar (House of Youth): Beit Noar will explore a variety of Judaic topics in which they have expressed interest. Students will learn about the Jewish approach to taking care of our bodies, minds, and spirits as it relates to drug and alcohol use, body modification, how we treat friends, how we expect to be treated, diet and exercise, and more.” In another unit, they’ll find out what our prayers mean and how to find personal connection to liturgy. They will explore hot topics such as abortion, animal experimentation, and more through a Jewish lens. This class will generally meet from 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. on Sundays. There will be 3-4 field trips during the year with extended hours.

Confirmation (Grade 10): Tenth grade students meet from 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. on Sundays, delving into a range of Judaic topics and how Jewish ideas can be relevant in their daily lives.

POLICIES CONCERNING REGISTRATION

Class Change Policy

We recognize that extra-curricular activities are an important element in students' lives; however, we also are firm in our belief that Jewish education must be given the highest priority. While we understand that "life happens," parents are urged to check activity schedules before Religious School registration is completed. Should the need still arise, all change requests must be submitted in writing to the Religious School Principal and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

To ensure a safe, comfortable learning environment for all our children, no class will be allowed to exceed maximum size. Please understand, therefore, that if the requested change would take the enrollment in that class beyond its maximum, the change will not be approved.

Withdrawal Policy

If a student is withdrawn prior to the start of Religious School in August, the full tuition amount paid will be refunded, minus a \$50 administration fee. Once classes have begun, no refunds will be given and all scheduled installment payments continue to be due.

Temple Kol Emeth Youth B'rit K'hilah - Code of Conduct:

I will promote the creation of a religious youth community based on mutual respect and a sense of personal well-being. I will treat others with kavod (honor and respect) because we are created b'tzelem Elohim (in the image of God). I have read the following rules, designed to promote the health and safety of all participants, and have indicated my complete acceptance by my signature and that of my parent/guardian.

- I will not possess, consume, or distribute alcoholic beverages, other than that served by adult leadership for Jewish sacramental purposes.
- I will not possess, use, or distribute any illegal drug or drug paraphernalia.
- I will not possess, smoke or consume or distribute tobacco products at any time during the event.
- I will attend and participate fully in the entire event, unless otherwise agreed upon with the Youth Director.
- I will arrive on time, stay until the end, and remain on the event premises at all times.
- I will not bring or use any weapons, firearms, or anything that may be construed as a weapon.
- I will not commit any illegal act. I understand that vandalism, disturbing the peace, or other inappropriate behavior as determined by the adult leadership in accordance with the youth leadership will not be tolerated. I understand that I will have to pay for any damage that I cause. I understand that no gambling is allowed, except for fundraisers approved by the adult leadership.
- I understand that no guests are allowed at any event, unless the adult leadership grants permission in advance, and that any unauthorized guests will be asked to leave immediately.
- If I am a licensed driver I will not drive during events, unless advance permission for a special situation is given in writing by my parent/guardian and granted by the Youth Director.
- I will not participate in any activities that could be deemed as hazing, sexually harassing, demeaning, or hurtful.
- I agree to refrain from inappropriate sexual behavior.
- I agree to abide by any additional rules, pertinent to a specific event, which may be announced, and to accept the consequences of their violation

If a teen does not comply with the Code of Conduct, the following disciplinary actions may be taken: Parent may be asked to escort their teen from an event immediately regardless of time of day or location of event. Teen may be suspended from the next event/s. Teen or parent may be asked to make restitution. Other actions may be taken on recommendations from Temple Kol Emeth leadership. Membership dues and event fees are non-refundable. In the case of damage to property, the family will be liable for the cost of repairs.
