From the Rabbi's Desk

Astronomers tell us that the moon is moving away from the earth at the rate of two inches per year. The moon is two inches further away than it was at this very moment last year. Because the moon affects gravitational pull this means that every one of us weighed less this Rosh Hashanah than we did last Rosh Hashanah.

Imagine that! You didn't have to exercise or eat differently, and you still weighed less. Now the amount of weight we all lost is equivalent to the weight of one potato chip and a thin potato chip at that. But that's still something and in approximately 500 billion years we will weigh nothing-so something to look forward to and it's effortless!

On the other hand, changing our lives, changing our ways, changing our habits takes some effort becoming the persons we wish to be takes dedication and work; it means acknowledging that we have caused some hurts to others; it means seeking forgiveness which is always difficult; it means ending some bad habits and adopting some better ones-that our lives might be richer.

So may our observance of the coming days of awe-the music, the liturgy, the words of the prayerbook provide the inspiration to consider our lives, contemplate our values and encourage us in becoming the persons we wish to be.

President's Message

Dear Fellow Congregants:

As we began to prepare for the Days of Awe this year, we realized it would be a year unlike any other. The Coronavirus has turned our world inside out. How can the High Holy Days be filled with joy, reflection and most important connection, when we cannot be together, greeting each other in the parking lot and lobby, wishing each other a Happy and Sweet New Year, with a strong handshake, a slap on the back or with a big hug? How would it feel when we cannot stand and schmooze as the Torahs are carried throughout the Sanctuary and Social Hall, where we can connect to them and shake the hands of our Rabbi and Leadership, as our young children and grandchildren lead the procession? And on Yom Kippur, how would we be able to ask for forgiveness for our sins against G-d, when we are surrounded by this pandemic – not knowing what will happen from day to day?

This year our High Holy Days were like no other, but we were together- connected virtually - bringing you services that were truly meaningful and authentic, led by Rabbi Sagal, who this year was joined by our guest Cantor, Janet Leuchter. We must look ahead, with anticipation, to a year of **good health**, filled with peace, sweetness and hope for our CBI community, the larger community, our country, Israel - and the rest of the world. It is with my deepest hope and prayers for a good year, that each day we take those steps necessary to bring us together – in person.

As I reflect back over these past months, I realize that in some ways, we have been together much more than in past years. Through the use of technology, even before we were forced to close the building, we determined to continue with classes, cultural programs, Thursday morning minyans, Friday evening and Shabbat morning services. Members and friends of our community continue to join us during Rabbi's and Cultural Programming's Tuesday morning classes and as we pray together on Thursday mornings and Shabbat - praying in Hebrew and in English, reading Torah and chanting Haftorah (with special thanks to Rabbi and Moshe Segal for reading Torah each week, to Steve Lee for leading the Thursday morning minyan, and to our members who continually volunteer to Chant Haftorah) - all sitting in the comfort of our homes or backyards – not missing a beat. It is great to see folks that do not often attend services in person – and I hope their attendance will continue when we reopen our doors.

As Mattie Stepanek, an American Poet wrote: "Unity is strength...when there is teamwork and collaboration, wonderful things can be achieved." And as Helen Keller has said, "Alone we can do so little, together we can do so much." Here's a shout out to the best team I could ask for: to Emilie Kovit-Meyer, Judy Kochis and Alice Macphee - who continue to administratively run our synagogue like a well-oiled machine. To our GAN Director, Suzanne Wycoff, we cannot thank her enough for all she has done and continues to do with our little ones. Suzanne and her teachers had Zoom classes running the day after we closed the building and miraculously ran a successful Camp Keshet, following all the rules and regulations to be in compliance with State Law and successfully opened the GAN with a full capacity on September 14th. Suzanne and her team of teachers are positively amazing. We are fortunate to be able to keep the GAN open and provide the necessary safety measures for our families with young children. Please note that the building remains closed except for the GAN classes. To Mike Wikes, our creative Director of Education, along with our dedicated teachers, we thank you for having our SHMA and Aleinu classes working well into June, providing the best Jewish education programs to our school age and high school students. SHMA and ALEINU classes are continuing virtually into the Fall and hopefully we will be able to open our classrooms sooner rather than later. I would be remiss if I did not thank the tireless efforts of our custodians – Donald Lewis, Will Calhoun and assisted by Blanca Flores, for keeping our building and grounds clean, sanitized and safe.

We also used this time to make improvements in the building - the chapel underwent major renovations following damage during the spring storms, and the GAN classrooms now have a refreshed look with new floors and newly painted classrooms, thanks in great part to Eric Menell.

I personally want to thank immediate Past President, Al Zager, for all his support and generous time this past year. Al sets the example of how a Past President should remain involved and committed. The Executive Committee and Board of Trustees continued to meet regularly and make decisions and set policy to enhance our community. Our committees continued to meet and plan programs, worked to increase and retain membership, plan outstanding programs and let's not forget planning for the High Holy Days. The Religious Committee was busy with planning ways to bring the High Holy Days home to each of you. I must give special thanks to Trustee for Religious Life, Sandy Rosenbloom, for jumping in and working tirelessly in the preparations for the holidays.

Last, but certainly not least, my special thanks to Rabbi Sagal. When Rabbi joined us as our full-time Rabbi, we asked what he was looking for from our congregation and he said a Partnership with the congregation. It is an honor and a privilege to work with Rabbi Sagal. - he makes a great partner. He has been and continues to be hands on and accessible – he is tireless in his efforts to be there for each and every one of our members and extended families.

CBI cares not only for its members, but for the members of our larger community. Many folks in our area are suffering from loss of jobs, finding it difficult to feed their families. Under the direction of Anne Greene and our Ezra committee we had a very successful fundraising drive and contributed nearly \$10,000 divided between Lunch Break and Jewish Family Services. In September, during the month of Elul, we held a food drive led by Sherri Harris and our Social Action committee, and donated more than 100 pounds of food to Lunch Break.

It is with great excitement that we look forward to our 100th anniversary. CBI will be 100 years old on January 5, 2022. The year 2022 we will have many opportunities to celebrate CBI's past, present and future. We will be announcing plans right after the Holidays - please join one of many committees and groups that will be planning for a year filled with memories, fun events, all culminating with our 100th anniversary Gala Event, to be held in November, 2022. There is so much to be thankful for here at CBI and even more to look forward to as we continue to **"BUILD FOR OUR FUTURE."**

In my speech on Yom Kippur, I spoke about our Budget Appeal. Once again we have an "angel" who is challenging more of us to donate, in any amount. If 180 member units donate (or pledge) by October 28, the "angel" will donate \$100 per member unit – this would mean an additional donation of \$18,000 to CBI! CBI's leadership and our "angel" expect everyone to give as much as they are comfortably able to give. But there is no minimum! If you are having a difficult time this year, we understand, but hope you can find a way to give something to the Appeal. So please return your pledge card by October 28.

I am truly honored and humbled to serve as President of CBI - even in light of the uncertainty that surrounds us. CBI's Mission Statement resonates with me as we observe and celebrate the most sacred time of the Jewish year: *"CBI is our Jewish home...it is a place for prayer, reflections, spirituality, shared observance and social mingling...a place to honor life-cycle events and celebrate Jewish life together."* We must live up to and go beyond our mission statement by providing different experiences to engage our members and encourage new members to join us. Our goals must help us to become more creative and innovative in our programming, our schools, and in our connection to CBI, so that we can strengthen our Jewish identity, continue to grow our community and become a more prominent player in the community at large. Even though our building is closed, our community remains open.

With the continued love and support of my family and friends, especially my husband Rich, our respected Gabbai, the Executive Committee, your dedicated Board of Trustees, and Committee Chairs, along with the help and guidance of Rabbi Sagal and the continued wisdom of Rabbi Rosoff, I will continue to do my best to get our community through these uncertain times and welcome everyone back to our physical building as soon as it is safe to do so.

I thank you for your confidence in my ability to help lead our community from strength to strength.

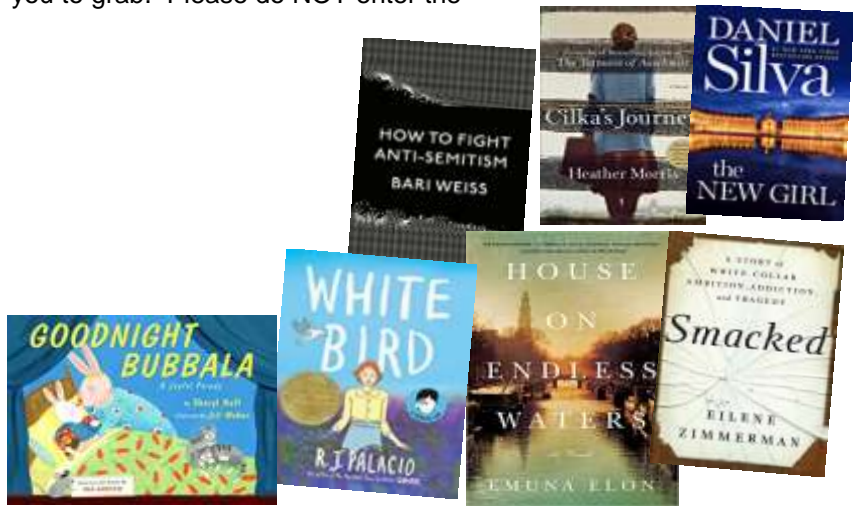

Blake Oliver Mason, son of Danielle and James Mason, brother to Ella Mason



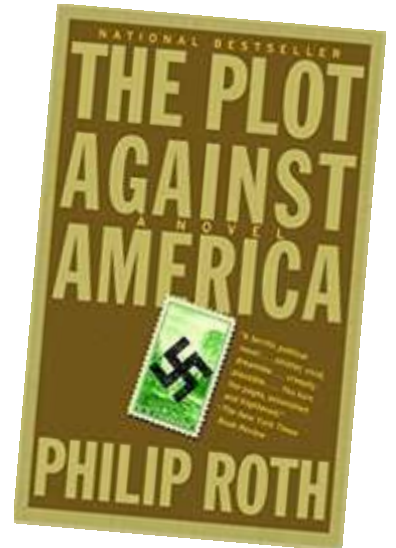
