New Year, New Programs at CBI

Hopefully the new secular year will bring health and prosperity and better times to all of us and all our neighbors and friends.

As we continue to work towards a more just, more equitable, and healthier world, I am truly excited to announce two new programs that

will begin in January at CBI.

The first is called "Fourth Friday" and as the name suggests, will take place on the fourth Friday night of every month. Fourth Friday is a new 6:00 PM service lasting about 20-25 minutes designed for families and children-and anyone who wishes to join! The service will consist of Shabbat prayers, stories, and songs and will be led by Rabbi Sagal. The Zoom link will be sent out before every service. Book Review from our CBI Library Committee

An Unorthodox Match by Naomi Ragen Review by Susan Glynn

Naomi Ragen has been described as the most popular novelist in Israel. Her books are always compelling, and she has dealt with many portions of the Jewish religion that many of her readers know little about.

In *An Unorthodox Match*, Ragen positions many disparate characters where they communicate, and fail to communicate on several levels.

Mother and daughter in the novel can't find a philosophical meeting ground, and the Orthodox community as well as the assimilated Jews in the story are outraged by one another.

The story moves swiftly along to its conclusion leaving the reader with new insights into the different groups within Judaism and the way many of them live.





From the Education Director

For those of you wondering if we can run our SHMA program virtually for a full year, the answer is yes. And I'm happy to report that, thanks to incredibly dedicated teachers, parents, students, lay leadership, and an inspirational Rabbi, SHMA is running quite successfully, in spite of the challenges.

I can now report that we have made tremendous progress in harnessing the power of online learning. In fact, I have been saying that this adaptation is nothing short of a

revolution in Jewish education. When we return to the classroom, we will be incorporating many of the technologies and methodologies that we learned during the pandemic.

To that end, we have enhanced our Hebrew curriculum with all the technology available. Students now learn to read prayers on an app called PrayerTech, customized for each grade level. The app provides games that improve Hebrew reading skills and explore the meaning of the prayers. Behrman House Publishers has made the primary Hebrew textbooks available in a "turn-page" online version so that students can read and do activities at home while the teacher displays and annotates the book on their computer screen. Quizlets provide flash cards and other games to learn vocabulary. And the list of online resources goes on and on.

Our Judaics curriculum -- following the timeline of Jewish History -- brings us to Judaism in the present day. In the leadup, students will create projects on any of three important periods in the 20th Century: Jewish Immigration to America, European Jewry (including the Holocaust) and the foundation of the Jewish State. Teachers continue to inspire creative and informative projects (Project Based Learning).

The semester in January begins with a school wide look at the Holocaust, delivering age appropriate lessons, based on the guidance of the US Holocaust Memorial Museum and other experts in the field. For our youngest, we are advised to focus students' attention on the concept of tolerance, to shine a light on the danger of prejudice and hate. For our older students, we will look at the factors that led to the rise of the Nazis and then explore stories of survival and defiance.

For our Immigration unit, we are planning a major initiative to involve all our SHMA families. We will ask parents to make a brief video telling the story of how their family arrived in America. All SHMA parents will be invited to participate and I predict that we will have a bounty of stories to share with each other. Just as we utilize Project - Based Learning, there is another equally important model known as "Narrative - Based Learning."

I personally think that this model will have the greatest impact on our students studying such recent history and will create lifelong memories both personal and in empathy with one another.

The unit will culminate in a virtual Ellis Island. Students will take on the role of one of their ancestors and we will use all the features of Zoom to send students from station to station as they complete their journey to America.

Our Shabbat Experience continues to be flexible and robust. For one brief period of time, when Covid cases were low and student sports were in full swing, we actually held a live Shabbat Experience in the CBI parking lot, with all Covid precautions in place. This latest surge has sent our Shabbat back onto Zoom. The virtual Shabbat Experience does have a lot to offer, with our resident ukulele Chazan, Sam Levine and a wide variety of prayer styles to keep kids actively engaged. Still, we can't wait to be back in the Chapel and back in the classrooms as well.

CBI's resident chef teaches us to make Purim Treats!



Hamentashen

4 cups flour
2 tsp baking powder
Pinch of salt
2/3 cup neutral oil
(i.e. canola, avocado etc...)
2 large eggs and 1 egg yolk
1 cup sugar
Zest of 1 lemon
Zest of 1 orange

2 -3 tbsp fresh lemon juice (half a lemon)
 4-5 tbsp fresh orange juice (or bottled orange juice)
Raspberry or apricot preserves, poppy seed filling or prune filling or any filling you desire
 1 eop for a wash

Note: This is a parve version and the dough itself needs to be made and chilled the day before if anyone is interested in making this along with me. It's very simple – mix all the dry ingredients in a bowl, add all the wet ingredients and zests and mix until well incorporated. Then form into a disk, wrap in plastic and refrigerate.

Chocolate Babka Demo

This will be a demo only. Making a babka is a very time intensive process with three separate risings. Thus it doesn't lend well to a follow along cooking demonstration.
