

Outline from The Open Door Haggadah

- p.4 Read “On this night” in English
- p.7 (Optional) read in English
- p.8 Blessing for lighting candles; on first night continue with *Shehecheyanu*. For this and other blessings, feminine God language is on the right hand side; more familiar masculine God language is on the left.
- p.10 (Optional) Blessing the children in English and/or Hebrew (call your children, if you have them and aren’t with them, and have them put the phone on their heads or something of the sort as you bless them!)
- p.12 (optional) Miriam’s Cup (read this page to introduce Miriam’s cup)
- p.15 (optional) Review the order (“*Seder*”) of the *Seder* in Hebrew and/or English; sing it in Hebrew if you wish
- p.16 1st cup of wine (read introduction)
- p.18 Blessing for the 1st cup of wine (skip portion in parenthesis at top of page). You can do just the short Hebrew blessing (you’ll see song #118 noted next to it) or continue to the Hebrew that follows for the rest of the page.
- p.23 First handwashing; no blessing is said
- p.24 *Karpas*; say the blessing and dip parsley in saltwater
- p.26 Break the middle *Matzah* & read in English (The bigger half of the middle *Matzah* becomes the *Afikoman*; don’t forget to hide it!)
- p.27 Read in English; sing *Ha Lachma Anya* in Hebrew if you wish
- p.30 Sing the 4 Questions in Hebrew; read them in English on the following page
- p.32 Read in English; sing *Avadim Hayinu* in Hebrew if you wish
- p.34-36 (Optional) Read one or all of these pages in English
- p.39 The 4 children (read in English through p.42)
- p.43 (optional) Read bottom of the page in English
- p.44 (optional) Sing *V’hi Sh’Amdah* in Hebrew
- p.46-51 Read the Passover story in English
- p.53 The 10 Plagues; read in Hebrew and/or English. Spill a drop of wine/grape juice from your cup with a spoon or finger for each of the plagues.

p.58 Read in English; sing Dayeinu in Hebrew. The stanzas that are most familiar are likely 1, 5 & 7.
Read Dayeinu in English on p. 60-61

p.63 Read in English to explain the key seder plate symbols (& continue on following page)

p.66 Read "In Every Generation" in English (and Hebrew too if you'd like). This is one of the most important phrases of the Passover *Seder*!

p.68-70 (Optional) Sing songs of praise in Hebrew (or read them in English)

p.72 2nd cup of wine (read in English and say the blessing in Hebrew!)

p.73 Second handwashing; say blessing

p.74 Say both *Motzi* and *Matzah* blessings (both blessings should be said before eating *Matzah*. The first is for bread in general and the second is for *Matzah* in particular.)

p.75 Say the blessing for bitter herbs (*Maror*) and have a little taste

p.76 Make and eat the Hillel sandwich (*Matzah, Charoset & Maror*)

p.78 Find & Eat the *Afikoman* (read in English if you'd like. This is a good place to serve & eat dessert)

p.79-83 Blessing after the meal (or just share what you are grateful for!)

p.84 3rd cup of wine; Read in English and say the blessing

p.85 Elijah's cup; Read in English, open the door, & sing *Eliyahu Hanavi* (p.88)

p.92-99 (Optional) Songs of praise; this is also a good place to sing other favorite Passover songs (see back of book) or Seder parodies (see supplement)

p.102 4th (& Final) cup of wine; Read in English and say blessing

p.112 *Nirtzah/Conclusion*: Read in English; sing *L'shanah Habaah B'Yerushalayim*
