Our Story

We are proud to be the oldest Jewish community between San Francisco and Portland, Oregon.

Congregation Society B'nai Israel of Petaluma began in 1864 and was incorporated by the State of California in 1871. By 1925, there were 200 Jewish families living in the "Egg Basket of the World," who joined together to establish the Jewish Community Center. The community was largely secular, but one room in the new building was designed as "the shul" to accommodate the small number of religious families in town. A major remodel begun in 2009 has retained many features of the original 1925 building, respecting its historical legacy while allowing for modernization and to accommodate future growth of the Petaluma Jewish community.
