High Holy Days 5782 Supplement



To our Ahavath Torah Congregation Members,

The Re-Opening Committee, along with the spiritual leadership, have made several decisions regarding the upcoming High Holidays and other activities in light of the current conditions with the pandemic. These decisions were reached by considering the health and well-being of our congregation, many of whom are at risk for serious illness, along with the recent sharp rise in the number of positive coronavirus cases in our state.

ATC will hold High Holiday services much like we did last year. The number of people who will be able to attend in person will be increased from last year, but not to exceed 60 members. All services will be live-streamed, so you may participate at home.

The High Holiday honors will also be handled as we did last year. Those members with an aliyah will be invited to attend in person. In the event anyone with an aliyah wishes not to participate in-shul, please contact Madeleine Lewis @ womenofatc@atorah.org. Those members with an aliyah are requested register (as noted below) and to arrive in shul by 9:15 am each day, as services will begin at 9:30 am.

For those members who do not have an aliyah, registration is on a first register-first serve basis. You may register at www.atorah.org. Please go to High Holidays and fill out the registration form.

ATC will require you do your best to not put yourself or others at risk. If you are ill, or have been around someone who is ill, please do not enter the building. All in-person attendees are required to be fully vaccinated for the coronavirus and to wear a facial covering while inside the building.

For those members joining live-streamed services, loaner prayer books are available for pick-up on Tuesday, August 31, Wednesday, September 1, and Thursday, September 2 from 10 am to 1 pm. Prayer books will also be made available Thursday evening, September 2 from 6-7:30 pm.

ATC will mail a 5782 Yizkor Book to each member's household.

Additional information:

- Shabbat Services, in shul, require facial coverings
- Yom Kippur's Break-the-fast will not be held this year.
- The start of Bingo will be moved to January 10, 2022
- Our planned Mah Jongg tournament will be rescheduled to early 2022
- The Women of ATC tea, on September 12, will be postponed
