

#### From the Rabbi's Desk


#### The Jewish New Year Celebrates All

Rosh HaShanah is the only holiday without a limit. It literally celebrates everything.

Other holidays celebrate events in history, or the relationship between God and Israel. But Rosh HaShanah celebrates the creation of the world; in other words, it is a song of gratitude for all that exists. We blow the *shofar* on Rosh HaShanah because if we sleepwalk through life we are violating the essence of the holiday - to see and feel joy in the created world and the G-d who made it. Indifference is the enemy, ennui... the sin, embrace... the answer.

The holiday that follows, Yom Kippur, is a symbolic enactment of death. We do not eat or bathe, and we dress in shrouds. Those who have not been grateful on Rosh HaShanah are asked to imagine what it would be like to be

without the world. What if there were no love, no words or music or mountains or sky? Perhaps only after Yom Kippur can we fully appreciate the message of Rosh HaShanah. One day all this will be gone for you. Rejoice now; celebrate now; hold the world and those you love close.

#### Join Our Thriving Virtual Continuing Education Classes

All classes begin at 8:00 PM, following Minyan.

On Sunday evening, our class is named *Be Careful What You Pray For; You Never Know What Might Come True* with Rabbi J. Common prayers that are included in Jewish liturgy are analyzed with attention focused on increasing Hebrew reading fluency.

Our current module is dedicated to High Holiday prayers. A greater understanding of the meaning of the prayers will make the words we say much more meaningful to us this year.

The next module will be focused on Shabbat Prayers.

On Tuesday nights, we are very fortunate to study Rabbinic Texts and Basic Jewish Concepts with Rabbi Gedalya Jeremias and Rabbi J. Selected topics and supporting texts give participants a deeper understanding of Jewish theology along with basic concepts such as Israel's election

(by G-d, not at the ballot box), end of life issues, resurrection, life after death, Messiah and Messianic times, etc. The discussion is lively and quite interesting and informative.

The New Adult B'nai Mitzvah Class will begin in September with Rabbi J and Arthur Arkanase for those who would like the experience, but never had the opportunity or would like to do so again.

There is also a Basic Hebrew Course for those who have little or no Hebrew reading and comprehension background with Madeleine Lewis.



#### **High Holy Day Guidelines**

#### Please take a moment to review.

1. For security reasons, no one will be admitted into the shul unless they have received a ticket in advance. There will be security, ushers and executive board members to greet you and check tickets at the door.

#### Everyone will be required to show a personalized ticket upon entry.

- 2. **Entrance to the Sanctuary is not permitted** during those parts of the service when worshippers are standing (e.g., the Amidah, Kedushah, Shofar Blowing, Ark Openings), as well as during Torah readings, recitation of Haftarah, Rabbi's sermon and President's address. Anyone wishing to enter will be asked to stand just inside the door until a proper time can be found to take a seat.
  - No one will be prohibited from leaving. If the doorway becomes crowded, people will be asked to discretely find seats in the rear of the Sanctuary.
- 3. All men must wear kippot in the synagogue. Jewish men will be asked to wear a tallit. Women have the option to wear a tallit and/or kippah. Please note that synagogue tallitot will be in short supply. If you own a tallit, you are encouraged to bring it.

#### Please do not wear a tallit when using the bathrooms.

- 4. Ushers at the sanctuary doors will have a list of those people who are receiving honors. If you have an honor, please contact an usher so that s/he can direct you to the bimah at the proper time.
- 5. Please be considerate of those at prayer and keep any talking to a minimum
- 6. No food, drink, cameras, writing or recording implements, or cell phones are permitted in the sanctuary at any time. Pagers must be set to vibration mode and cell phones must be turned off.
- 7. ALL MEDICAL PERSONNEL, please inform an usher that you are present and where you will be sitting.
- 8. As always, seating is on a first come, first served basis. We ask everyone to please keep his or her voice down in the foyer adjacent to the sanctuary. When leaving the sanctuary, please do so immediately and quietly, as to not disrupt those members who care to enjoy the remainder of the service.



#### **High Holy Day Guidelines**

#### **Parking**

Parking is available in the synagogue lot on a very limited basis, and, as always, is first-come first-served.

Our parking lot attendants try to accommodate those individuals with special needs, however, once again, given the size of our lot, we ask those individuals to call our office should special arrangements need to be made.

Stoughton schools and the Stoughton District Court are both open and in session; therefore, you may not park there. Additional parking will be available on McEvoy Circle (off Pearl Street). For Kol Nidre and evening Yom Kippur services ONLY, you may park at the courthouse and the Richard Wilkins (West) School after they have closed.

Parking is prohibited at CVS or Walgreens. If you park there, you do so at your own risk.
