

From the Rabbi's Desk

Apples and Honey

We all know the song:

Dip the apple in the honey

Make a Brachah loud and clear,

Shana Tova u'Metukah

Have a happy, sweet new year.

Reb Tzadok HaKohen of Lublin unveils profound meaning hidden within this cherished, age-old custom of dipping the apple in honey.

When our forebears eagerly accepted the Torah at Sinai, they used the words, *Na'aseh v'Nishma* - We shall do, and we shall understand/listen. This revolutionary statement earned them an eternal, intimate relationship with G-d.

Its message is clear. In order to truly understand, one must first do. To theorize Judaism without actually experiencing it is like trying to explain colors to a blind person. Mere words cannot do justice.

"Taste and see that G-d is good", we read in Psalms 34:9. To genuinely appreciate the Torah for what it is, one must sink one's teeth into it. Only then can one relish the fine cuisine for what it truly is.

The apple represents the willingness to do even before one understands. "Why are the Jewish people compared to an apple? To teach us the following. Just as regarding the apple, the fruit comes before the leaves, so too, the Jewish

people said *Na'aseh* ahead of *Nishma*" (Tractate Shabbat 88a). Judaism is a study in spontaneity (See ibid.). One must take a leap of action before one can hope to esteem.

Only then can we experience the Torah's special sweetness

as expressed so wonderfully by the Psalmist "sweeter than honey, and drippings from the combs (Psalm 19:11)." When *Nishma* - the need to understand - is preceded by *Na'aseh* - the unconditional fulfillment of *mitzvot* - the most delicious nectar imaginable is produced. When *Na'aseh* is contingent upon a prerequisite *Nishma*, when a person insists on understanding before acting, he will always be left with blandness; no apple, no honey, no taste.

This is our goal on Rosh HaShanah. By proclaiming G-d our King (the leitmotif expressed throughout the liturgy), by completely subjugating our selves to Him, we hereby accept unconditionally any decrees He may wish to enact. The resultant radiance is the most brilliant of lights, the most profound of joys.

"Light is sown for the righteous, and for the upright of heart, joy"(Psalm 97:11).

From my family to yours, a K'tiva v'Chtsima Tova!





High Holy Day Guidelines

Please take a moment to review.

1. For security reasons, no one will be admitted into the shul unless they have received a ticket in advance. There will be security, ushers and executive board members to greet you and check tickets at the door.

Everyone will be required to show a personalized ticket upon entry.

2. **Entrance to the Sanctuary is not permitted** during those parts of the service when worshippers are standing (e.g., the Amidah, Kedushah, Shofar Blowing, Ark Openings), as well as during Torah readings, recitation of Haftarah, Rabbi's sermon and President's address. Anyone wishing to enter will be asked to stand just inside the door until a proper time can be found to take a seat.

No one will be prohibited from leaving. If the doorway becomes crowded, people will be asked to discretely find seats in the rear of the Sanctuary.

3. All men must wear kippot in the synagogue. Jewish men will be asked to wear a tallit. Women have the option to wear a tallit and/or kippah. Please note that synagogue tallitot will be in short supply. If you own a tallit, you are encouraged to bring it.

Please do not wear a tallit when using the bathrooms.

- 4. Ushers at the sanctuary doors will have a list of those people who are receiving honors. If you have an honor, please contact an usher so that s/he can direct you to the bimah at the proper time.
- 5. Please be considerate of those at prayer and keep any talking to a minimum
- 6. No food, drink, cameras, writing or recording implements, or cell phones are permitted in the sanctuary at any time. Pagers must be set to vibration mode and cell phones must be turned off.
- 7. ALL MEDICAL PERSONNEL, please inform an usher that you are present and where you will be sitting.
- 8. As always, seating is on a first come, first served basis. We ask everyone to please keep his or her voice down in the foyer adjacent to the sanctuary. When leaving the sanctuary, please do so immediately and quietly, as to not disrupt those members who care to enjoy the remainder of the service.



High Holy Day Guidelines

Parking

Parking is available in the synagogue lot on a very limited basis, and, as always, is first-come first-served.

Our parking lot attendants try to accommodate those individuals with special needs, however, once again, given the size of our lot, we ask those individuals to call our office should special arrangements need to be made.

Stoughton schools and the Stoughton District Court are both closed on Rosh Hashanah; therefore, you may park there on Saturday and Sunday. Additional parking will be available on McEvoy Circle (off Pearl Street). For Kol Nidre and evening Yom Kippur services ONLY, you may park at the courthouse and the Richard Wilkins (West) School after they have closed.

Parking will be available on Central Street in designated areas only. Watch for signs. Violators will be ticketed.

Parking is prohibited at CVS or Walgreens. If you park there, you do so at your own risk.




Now has a name!
