

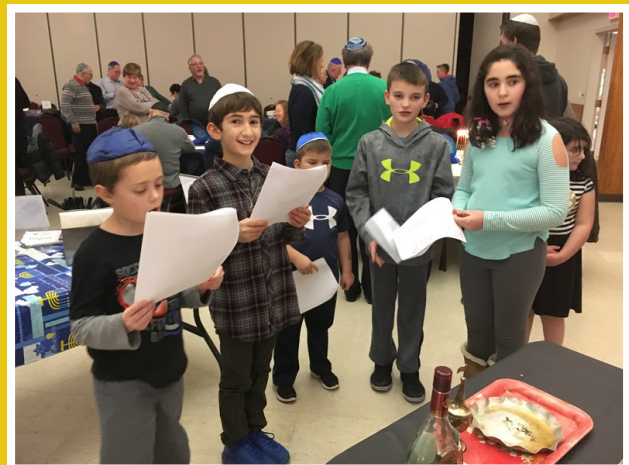
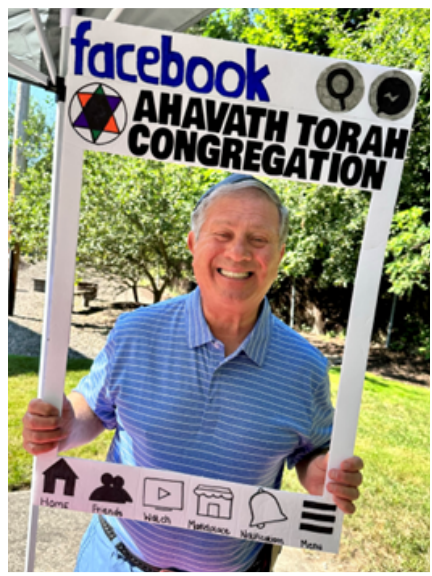

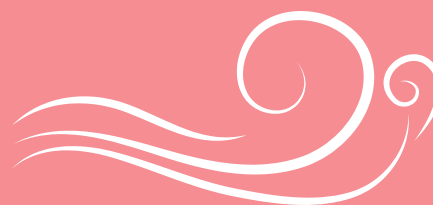
Special musical themes and melodies, evocative and celebratory, are an occasion for personal introspection and spiritual virtuosity.

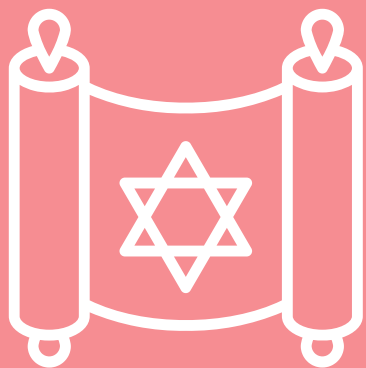

Tashlich: Casting off for the new year

What is Tashlich?

On the second day of Rosh Hashanah, Jews symbolically cast off the sins of the previous year by tossing pebbles, or bread crumbs, into flowing water.

During this ritual, people think of the things they've done wrong in the past year, and "throw them away", promising for an improvement in the coming year.

This year, Tashlich will take place immediately following Musaf in the rear of the parking lot.
