Rabbi's Message – Starting This Crazy Year Off Right... Together



Why is this year different from all other years? Oh, wait. That's the wrong holiday, isn't it? But it sure does feel applicable... The year continues to feel unprecedented, unlike anything any of us has ever experienced. Pandemic, social unrest, economic struggles, quarantine,

election upheaval, and more. It's enough to make anyone feel stressed out and overwhelmed. But one thing we need to remind one another, over and over again, is that we are not alone. We are all going through this together, and we will emerge on the other side of all this chaos together as well. In some ways, you might say that this is why we have community in the first place.

A lot of times, we come together to celebrate life cycle events and annual traditions. But throughout my years as a rabbi, I've always noticed that community is at its finest when it's helping someone get through a tough time. We rise to the challenge, we bring food, support, words of comfort, and assistance, to help scaffold someone who is struggling and/or grieving. We build up the strong bonds of congregation in the good (and also in the mundane) times... but we then put those connections and relationships to the test when someone needs us. OR when we all need each other. This is clearly one of those times.



So as we prepare for the start of the new year, there is so much that we, as a faith community and extensive network of relationships, can do to support one another. Can we end the pandemic, solve racism, or decide the outcome of the election? No. But there is actually SO MUCH that we can still do. In a few weeks, it will begin in earnest with the High Holidays. Services are going to be VERY different from what any of us is used to. That is undeniable. But Rabbi Miller and I will still be at Ohev Shalom, and will still be conducting the service together with lots of leadership and staff support, and with plenty of participation from, and engagement of, congregants. We will begin the year both acknowledging how different and weird everything is, AND also by still coming together, still observing our rituals and traditions, and still supporting one another.

That is how the year will begin. But then moving forward, how ELSE can we support one another? What do you need, and/or how can you be there for someone else? Do you want to get more involved, or do you just need someone to check in on you... or on a fellow congregant you know needs a little more care and community? We all need to proceed into this new year with compassion for ourselves and one another, as well as a clear awareness that we are also feeling stressed and MAY snap at someone else, feel irritable, and/or not get enough sleep. It's okay.

FUSE has created a new normal, just as the rest of us have had to do! Over the past 6 years, we have been holding in-person meetings that enabled people to share a meal, have our traditional Courageous Conversation as a group, and hold personal networking conversations.

During the summer, we held two virtual meetings and engaged our membership in some truly courageous conversations. Recognizing the tremendous upheaval in communities, FUSE asked our members to offer their thoughts on where our organization should go.

The Steering Committee has been consolidating the information gathered and will share the results at our next virtual meeting, Monday October 12th. To assure the security of our sessions, *registration is now required for all FUSE Conversation ZOOM events.*

FUSE received a grant from Swarthmore Presbyterian Church to support a program called the Care Team. We are partnering with the Chester Police Department to identify the families of murder victims of Chester. FUSE will then be arranging to send a meal to the families, and virtually for now, offer

“attendance” at funeral or vigils.


