President's Message

I have a hard time focusing on prayer in services. I know that seems odd since I attend pretty regularly, but it's true. And it's nothing new. I'm easily distracted and there's so much that rattles around in my head – Ohev stuff, kids, family, work, conversations I'd had, conversations I need to have, things I'd done the day before and things I need to do that day, what to write for this column, what to make for dinner... The list is endless. I suspect I'm not alone in this.

It's even more challenging at the High Holidays. So many people coming in and going out of the sanctuary. When I'm on the bimah, I'm also keeping my eyes out for anything that needs my attention, whether it's something one of the Rabbis needs or any other thing that crops up during the service. And as you might know, I'm pretty social and really enjoy getting the chance to talk with people.

But the music usually draws me in. Singing along with Rabbi Miller, or hearing a new melody that she introduces that intrigues me. Listening to the beautiful instrumental Kol Nidre at the beginning of the Kol Nidre service. And the Kol Nidre prayer itself can absolutely transport me. Sometimes I just close my eyes and let the prayers wash over me. During this High Holiday season, I hope you find a way to connect too - whether it's in prayer, listening to or singing with Rabbi Miller, listening to one of Rabbi Gerber's sermons, or just enjoying being with other members of the community.

I would be remiss if I didn't take time to thank the many people who help to make the holidays run so smoothly. Rabbis Gerber and Miller plan the services. Rabbi Miller lined up tot service and Junior Congregation leaders. Lisa Karlin put together this year's Yizkor book. Bonnie Breit took on the Koved Committee for this year, which assigns all of the Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur honors. Bonnie then spent the rest of the summer (and will continue right through the beginning of Neilah on Yom Kippur), making sure that all of the honors are filled and

keeping Rabbi Gerber informed of "on the fly" changes that occur during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services. Thank you, Bonnie! Missy Lowdermilk arranged babysitters. Bev Dickson spent many hours putting together the synagogue directory and the dedication program. The Hoffman and Whelpley families oversee the food drive. Joel Fein put together our greeter schedule and the list of calls to congregants from the Board of Directors. Alan Schapire organized the ushers. Lise Fishman organized the Rosh Hashanah kiddushes. Karen Stesis is planning the annual break-the-fast. Cathy Baum is doing outreach with new and potential members.

In the synagogue office, Missy, Janean, and the office volunteers helped to get everything organized, requests met, and packets stuffed. Missy has a ridiculously long checklist of things to do before the holiday arrives, from laying out the summer High Holiday L'Chaim issue, to arranging security, to making sure that all of the important information is available on the Ohev web site. And then there's Steve Smith, who made sure that everything was clean and ready for the holidays. He also pulled the regular prayer books from the sanctuary and put in the Mahzors (High Holiday prayer books), and set up the chairs in the auditorium.

So, thank you to everyone who makes the holidays seem so easy and seamless. If I missed you, please accept my apologies and know that your contribution is still greatly appreciated.

Rabbi's Message – Past, Present, and Pizza



Some of you already know that on the first Thursday of every month, a group of Ohevites meets at Pinocchio's Pizza in Media for a Lunch n' Learn. We rent out their upstairs room (which you possibly didn't even know existed!), and spend an hour-and-a-half or so, eating pizza and

salad, and learning about Judaism, or aspects of the world through a Jewish lens. Sometimes we get 14 people, other times we've hit close to 40. We seem to have formed a die-hard group of Lunchers N' Learners, who generally try to come every month, though all are welcome! This year, we're mixing it up.

In honor of Ohev's centennial celebration, our Lunch n' Learn in 5780 (2019-2020) is going to be a bit different. I thought we might spend the next few months delving into the history of the Jews who settled in Chester, where our congregation was founded. I already began this topic at LnL in July and August, but so far we haven't even gotten to the founding of the synagogue in 1920!

On October 17th (yes, I know it's not the first Thursday of the month... read on...), we will continue our conversation in the Ohev Sukkah. Then, on November 7th, we'll return to our usual venue (Pinocchio's in Media) and normal schedule. My hope is that we'll not only learn about the story of B'nai Israel and B'nai Aaron becoming Ohev Sholom (with a faction forming Mispallelim), then Ohev Shalom, then moving to Wallingford - but that it'll teach us something else vital as well. Our story is a microcosm of American Jewry everywhere, and even includes elements of worldwide Jewish migration patterns, AND the stories of all minorities in this country. You might be surprised to learn how they all overlap, intertwine, and share themes.

So, whether or not you personally were born in Chester, or have family from there, this is YOUR story too! Our Centennial is an opportunity to look back at our incredible history, and how we've been present to some

pivotal moments in the history of our entire nation. But it's also a chance to see yourself in that history, to understand how it reflects your life, your story... and hopefully, your future. And if that isn't enough to entice you, I'll also divulge that there are some CRAZY, HBO-worthy anecdotes in there that you DON'T wanna miss!!

And you can learn all about our wonderful and turbulent past, every first Thursday at noon, over a delicious (and most-popular) slice of mushroom-and-onion pizza!

Mispallelim — The Way of the Land



It is good to be back in the swing of things, working with the Mispallelim students and their families once again. The beginning of the year is always special, but I am particularly looking forward to this year, since we are working with a rewritten curriculum, which I developed over the summer with the help of some members of the School Committee.

The decision to refresh the curriculum came out of a number of exciting discussions that emerged over the course of the year in the School Committee, as we worked to understand how best to take advantage of this community's special talents, interests, and connections. We also had many discussions about better integrating Shabbat experiences into the life of the Religious School.

There is a lot that is new (including a "Mispallelim Newspaper," which will appear on the bulletin board after each curricular unit!), and a few things that feel more experimental (including several single-class field trips to natural areas to explore connections between Judaism and nature). But one thing from last year that we are going to really deepen into is a commitment to teaching and modeling Derech Eretz.

The term Derech Eretz translates literally as "the Way of the Land," but it really means something more like "common courtesy," or "prosocial behavior." The ancient rabbis understood that there are certain behaviors that we can mandate and enforce through legislation (Halachah), and there are other, often more subtle behaviors that can't necessarily be legislated, but which are part of creating a culture of courtesy and dignity for all. Small acts such as greeting others when we see them, holding doors open, including others in our games or conversations, addressing others with respect, and listening when other people are speaking are all part of this group of behaviors called Derech Eretz.

It is sometimes tempting to discount this area of Jewish education as "nice but not

essential," since there are so many content areas that we need to cover in a year. If we are putting so much focus on Derech Eretz, how will we ever get to the holiday cycle, the liturgy, Hebrew language, etc.? Can't these students learn about Derech Eretz elsewhere in their lives?

When I feel that temptation, I call to mind Rabbi Elazar ben Azaria's statement in Pirkei Avot (Ethics of our Ancestors): "If there is no Derech Eretz, there is no Torah. If there is no Torah, there is no Derech Eretz." Rabbi Elazar reminds us that trying to teach Torah without also affirming the dignity and belonging of every member of our community through practicing Derech Eretz ultimately results in alienation from Torah and from the spiritual treasures of Judaism. Similarly, if all we teach is the behaviors of Derech Eretz, without connecting it back to Torah and Jewish life and language, all we are doing is running an etiquette school (which is nice, but obviously not the point!).

In modelling Derech Eretz as a foundation of Jewish community, and in continuously connecting the principles of Derech Eretz to our sacred texts, rituals, and experiences, we begin to see the power that Torah and Derech Eretz have to animate one another, and to encourage meaningful, purposeful, joyful Jewish community.




Rabbi Louis Kaplan served as Congregation Ohev Shalom's pulpit Rabbi from August 1, 1961 to June 30, 1992 and again from July 1, 2001 to July 31, 2002.
