

## **Kehilat Nitzan COVID19 Protocols**

### **1. Registration and Record keeping requirements**

To support contact tracing, Kehilat Nitzan must request that each person who attends the premises for more than 15 minutes (including staff) provide their: first name and phone number.

We will provide a list of all member names and numbers. The security guard will mark off your name on that list.

### **2. Masks**

As the service includes singing (where the voice projects breath up to 5 metres), we must insist that all congregants and visitors wear masks.

This rule applies unless congregants are called up or have some similar honour where they may remove their masks for that time.

### **3. Social distancing**

Kehilat Nitzan has arranged the velvet chairs according to social distancing guidelines of at least two (2) square metres for each person seated indoors.

### **4. Hand Hygiene**

The Shule will provide hand sanitiser for use upon arrival.

The Shule also provides soap and paper towelling in the toilets.

### **5. Food**

The kitchen will be closed for the foreseeable future. For the time being, there will be very limited Kiddushim after the service.

When celebrating a Simcha it will be possible to throw wrapped, kosher hard sweets, and to have Kosher catered Kiddushim.

Food boxes can be handed out. Unboxed food will be served by the catering staff.

It is advisable to bring your own drink bottle.

### **6. General Safety Protocols**

As much as we will be thrilled to see each other we must greet one another in the COVID-19 way, so please no hugging or kissing. Please remain at least 1.5

metres apart wherever possible. Please do not kiss or touch the Mezzuzah or the Torah.

Please bring your own Kippah and Tallit and, where possible, your own Siddur. Remember that you must wear a mask at all times.
