



Congregation Shir Tikvah Shabbat Prayer Opportunites

At CST, every Shabbat contains a Friday night service. Saturday morning services are held at least once per month. Please check the calendar of services for exact service times each weekend or go online to www.shirtikvah.org/events.

Friday Night Services:

6:15 p.m. Short & Sweet Service "Short and Sweets" are designed for a more traditional Shabbat experience while still offering our unique Shir Tikvah spirituality. These services only last 45 minutes so that you can head home or out to eat for Shabbat dinner and are preceded by a "preneg," a light snack to tide you over. There is no oneg following the service.

7:15 p.m. Music Shabbat
Full of singing, dancing and Shabbat warmth, these services are informal, high-energy, and perfect for both adults and children. This service is often followed by an "oneg" of coffee, refreshments and desserts.

7:15 p.m. Traditional Service Geared towards adults (though open to children as well), this service contains more liturgy than the other services and an in-depth sermon or Torah discussion. This service is often followed by an "oneg" of coffee, refreshments and desserts.

Tot Shabbat Service

Our Tot Shabbat service is a prayer experience geared toward children 7 years old and younger and their families. Full of music, movement, and age-appropriate teaching, these services are scheduled throughout the year on varying Friday nights or Saturday mornings . Fridays begin at 6:15 p.m. and Saturdays at 10:00 a.m. and last approximately 30 minutes. Fun crafts and kid-friendly snacks follow the service in our Tikvah Explorer's classroom.

Saturday Morning Service

These are led by our b-mitzvah young adults, offering an incredible opportunity to see the in-depth training Shir Tikvah offers its Family Education students and the wonderful individuality that each 13-year old brings to prayer and Torah study. We also occasionally have Tot Shabbat services on Saturday mornings. This service is followed by an "oneg" of coffee, refreshments and desserts, or in the case of a Tot Shabbat, a kid-friendly oneg with crafts.

I am thrilled to introduce CST's Family Ed Curriculum Project.
Although this project may be new to many of you, we have been working behind the scenes on it for several years. Over the decades our congregational school has been blessed with a team of dedicated and knowledgeable educators who have lovingly taught our kids with lessons and curriculum they themselves created. As these amazing teachers retire and move on, we have decided the strongest way to ensure the success and strength of our school is by writing a PreK through 6th grade curriculum that captures our unique and powerful idea of progressive Judaism. We are undertaking the CST Family Ed Curriculum Project to ensure that we will not merely survive, but thrive for future generations.

A project of this magnitude requires a great deal of planning and significant resources of both time and money. On behalf of Shir Tikvah, I applied for and received an incredibly generous grant from the Hermelin-Davidson Center for Congregation Excellence. After careful consideration your Board of Trustees also earmarked some matching funds. With the support of Rabbi Alicia, I put together the Curriculum Committee made up of a phenomenal group of Shir Tikvah teachers and lay educators from our community. This committee helped to shape the parameters and priorities of CST's Curriculum Project. Then, Rabbi Alicia and I, with the thoughtful advice and guidance from this committee, spent hours revising and rewriting our school's scope and sequence. Only after all of this was done, were we able to post the job nationally.


We received over 50 resumes and narrowed the list down to 7 highly qualified individuals. After Marcia Leibson and I interviewed them, the choice was clear. I am thrilled to introduce you to our new curriculum writer, Stacy Rosenthal. Stacy lives in Phoenix and recently retired after 20 years as Senior Director of Education and Youth Engagement at Congregation Beth Israel, a Reform congregation in Scottsdale, Arizona. She oversaw all aspects of the education programs from preschool to high school. She is passionate about Jewish education and creating curriculum that is engaging, relevant and custom designed for our congregation. Stacy is also the First Vice President of the ARJE, the Association of Reform Jewish Educators, and is looking forward to becoming President in January of 2025. Stacy has already begun writing pilot lessons and we are excited to begin implementation. Stacy understands that we have a rich history and strong school. She is committed to working with our faculty to retain our favorite, successful lessons.

I know I do not need to remind you the reasons that this has been an incredibly difficult few months to be a Jew. Maybe this is why I am more grateful that ever for our Shir Tikvah community. And, despite what is happening in our world I am filled with optimism for our congregation. I know that our incredible curriculum committee and Stacy Rosenthal will ensure the Sam and Jean Frankel Family Education Program will thrive for generations to come.I am happy to answer any questions you may have.

Soup Troupe



The Shir Tikvah Series on Mass Encarceration

The Shir Tikvah social justice series of programs on Mass Incarceration will continue into the New Year. Please watch the weekly bulletins for details.nOver the last three months we've held the following events:

- Barry Rubin facilitated a discussion on the book The New Jim Crow: Mass Incarceration in the Era of Color-Blindness by Michelle Alexander. This is probably the most important and complete book written on the topic.
- Jackie Curry and two other speakers introduced us to the organization the Nation Outside. For more information check out the Oakland County branch on Facebook. If you're not on social media call Jackie directly at 248-993-6389. The organization works primarily on gaining housing, employment and access to help with mental health problems for citizens returning from incarceration.
- Also in November, Rochelle Rubin made a presentation on the history of Black oppression in the United States from slavery to the Jim Crow era to the age of Mass Incarceration. She used slides from our trip to Montgomery, AL to illustrate many scenes from this history.
- In December, Ronnie and Felecia Waters, made presentations about two organizations they work for. Ronnie spoke about Safe and Just Michigan. It works on legislation and with the legal system to promote justice in the criminal justice system. Felecia operates her own 501c3 called "Get to Seven," which works to "make whole" returning citizens. For more information, on Safe and Just, simply go to their website. They are headquartered in Lansing. For more on "Get to Seven" contact Felecia at 248-396-4940. Another returning citizen Riccardo Ferrell, spoke to us, sharing his personal story in great detail. He has written a number of articles about his experience in prison for 40 years. We will share information in the future about how to access his works.

We'd like to thank again all the presenters and those of you who attended. This has been an exciting set of learning experiences. More to come!




