Service Types

- Traditional (Saturday morning)
- Shir Hadash (Saturday morning)
- Mincha (Afternoon service)
 - In the Traditional and Shir Hadash services, the B'nai Mitzvah celebration is one part of the regularly occurring service. The B'nai Mitzvah is not the entire focus of the service. Mincha B'nai Mitzvah allow for a service entirely focused on the B'nai Mitzvah and allow for more customization.
- All services are musical!

Traditional

- Always takes place in the sanctuary
- 9:30am-12pm
- Tunes are largely shared with Conservative synagogues across the country
- A nice, consistent group of attendees that you can get to know as you attend services in the year before your B'nai Mitzvah
- This service represents 90 years of HEA history
- Includes the opportunity to learn Mussaf, the additional service for Shabbat
- More opportunity for learning Nusach (the musical phrases we use for chanting the Shacharit and Mussaf services) as well as Haftarah

Shir Hadash

- Originally designed for the GYC or the Social Hall.
 Families may choose to have their service in the sanctuary, but this is not the default option and has some musical drawbacks. Size limitations exclude having a b'nai mitzvah service in the GYC.
- 9:30am-12pm
- Uses hand drums
- Emphasizes group singing and distributed leadership
- Does not include Haftarah
- Requires additional commitment to joining the davening team in the 6 months before the BM date.
 Also requires commitment to attending monthly 45minute Shabbat morning class with Eitan.


Mincha

- Service can be separate from regular lay-led afternoon services (more focused on the b'nai mitzvah) or can be part of the regular lay-led afternoon services (a built in minyan)
- Start time depends on time of year
- Option to include Ma'ariv (evening service) and Havdalah (service for ending Shabbat) depending on service timing and sunset timing

The chapel is a nice venue if you have under 100 guests. The chapel creates a sense of coziness. Otherwise, this service is held in the sanctuary.

Timeline for B'nai Mitzvah and Mensch Academy 2024-2027 FROM 4TH GRADE TO 7TH GRADE

4th & 5th grade

Date Selection process begins in 4th grade by Cohort

Assignment and finalizing date choices - \$50 administrative fee

4^{th &} 5th Grade Mini-Retreat

Focused on Cohort community building 1 Shabbat Cohort dinner for 4th & 5th grade families

6th grade

B'nai Mitzvah

- •13 months prior: Family meeting with B'nai Mitzvah coordinator and Rabbi
- •Select approved tutor and begin tutoring at least 12 months before date
- •Schedule 3 Clergy meetings and 2 meetings with Eitan Kantor

Kids

- Enroll in Mensch Academy!
- Curriculum focuses on the meaning of prayers, Torah commentaries, growing up, & Jewish identity
- Mitzvah Volunteer Day
- •6th Grade Retreat

Families

- Mensch Academy family programs, i.e. 6th & 7th Grade Shabbat dinner
- Service requirements- attend 15 Shabbat services during the year prior to BM, primarily the service that they will lead.
- •Other family-planned social opportunities as desired

•\$275 admin fee for all B'nai Mitzvah families (waived for Members+ levels)

- •Tuition for 6th Grade Mensch Academy sessions **TBD**
- Additional cost for 6th Grade Retreat

7th grade

B'nai Mitzvah

- Week of Attend Thursday morning minyan as a family & final practice afterwards!
- •Get called to the Torah for the first time and put on tallit and/or tefillin
- Practice on the bima with your tutor, the clergy & take photos
- •The big day!

Kids

- Mensch Academy! Sunday sessions
- Moving Traditions B'nai Mitzvah curriculum.
- Builds on the development from the 6th grade classes
- •7th & 8th Grade Retreat April 12-14, 2024
- •Cohort programs are primarily through the Youth Groups

Families

- Mensch Academy family programs, i.e. 6th & 7th Grade Shabbat dinner
- •Service requirements- attend 15 Shabbat services during the year prior to BM, primarily the service that they will lead.
- Support your Cohort! Attend their B'nai Mitzvah services

- Thursday morning minyan – breakfast (\$300ish)
- Shabbat Kiddush lunch – al a carte pricing
- \$ TBD tuition for Mensch Academy 7 grade
- Additional cost for Retreat

B'nai Mitzvah preparation timeline

13 months before

- Initial family meeting with Officiating Rabbi & B'nai Mitzvah coordinator
- Interview 3 HEA Approved tutors, select a tutor and begin tutoring at least 12 months before date
- Continue going to services to learn choreography and prayer in practice

6 months

- 1st meeting w/ Eitan Kantor
- Begin mitzvah project (optional)
- Check in w/ BM Coordinator Update us on the progress with your tutor

5 months

- Submit all rental contracts for use of HEA space (for Social Hall party, e.g.)
- Reach out to Rabbis' assistant to set a D'var Torah writing meeting with officiating rabbi

2-3 months

- Check in w/BM Coordinator- making sure everything is planned and no detail is forgotten.
- Set dates to start participating in upcoming services to lead 1-2 prayers

1 month

- Check in with officiating rabbi at ~ 6 weeks & 2 weeks
- •2 Shir Hadash rehearsal/practices with Eitan
- Submit Honors form to BM Coordinator at 3 weeks
