The good news is that we are ok. The bad news, as we have been reminded repeatedly of late, is that antisemitism keeps rearing its ugly head. Whether we see it from the likes of Kanye's tweets and interviews, or when a madman takes a synagogue's members hostage in Texas or even when in our backyard, a radicalized individual screams obscenities against Jews and Israel during preschool drop off, we know it is on the rise. According to last year's FBI hate crime statistics, Jews were the targets of 54.9% of all religiously motivated actions. Remember, we're only 2% of this country's population. And now, according to the

ADL, it's increased even more.

The scholar Paul Johnson describes antisemitism as a virus that constantly exists in our world, just as we have viruses living in our bodies all the time. The metaphor works like this – that when our society is healthy, we won't see much of it, let alone feel its effects. But when we are sick, when our society is ill, that virus rears its ugliness. Maybe that is what we're seeing right now.

Want to argue with that and they'll say you have poisoned the media. It makes no sense logically because you literally have hate-filled ignorant zealots saying and perpetuating irrational and inane things. Of course, we can't merely throw up our hands and say that antisemites will be antisemites and go our merry way. We have to be informed and aware, to speak out when we see or feel it is present. To remain vigilant.

The former chief rabbi of Great Britain, Lord Rabbi Jonathan Sacks z"l said it best. "Non-Jews respect Jews who respect Judaism, and they are embarrassed by Jews who are embarrassed by Judaism." What is more attractive than people confident in themselves, grateful for their historical legacy and proud of their culture?

So yes, we must fight antisemitism wherever and whenever it appears. We

With the divisiveness we find in our country today, it becomes that much easier to make the Jewish community the target – from all sides. When calls are made about our dual loyalty, we are hearing tropes used by generations before who have been out for us. Enemies of the people, globalists to be concerned about. And Israel comes to replace Jew as the diabolical controller of all the ills in our world.

But here's another reality we must remember. We cannot allow antisemitism to define us. We are Jewish, we are a part of this community, not because of any names they call us or lies they say about us but because we belong to an extraordinary tradition that affirms life and provides meaning to our days. We are who we are because of the meaning and beauty Judaism offers rather than how we might respond to those who hate us.

These are the blessings so important to our lives. These are the blessings that will continue making us even stronger as a community.







Expressing Thanksgiving for a Warm Welcome

Since early February 2022, the Pine Hill Congregational Church has been blessed to be meeting in the sanctuary of Temple Shir Shalom on Sunday mornings. As many may be aware, the church sold its building and grounds on Middlebelt Road between Long Lake and Lone Pine Roads and ventured on a journey into the unknown of the "wilderness" to discern the next step that we might be called to take. We knew that we wanted to continue to worship together weekly and do the active, engaged ministry that Pine Hill has done for decades in and around West Bloomfield and metropolitan Detroit,

so a sub-committee of our "Moving Forward" team was formed in order to find that space and place where we could continue our service and mission.

Because of the church's long involvement in interfaith work, among the over 60 sites that were researched (most of which were storefronts), a deliberate decision was made to inquire about the potential for sharing space with a Jewish community. For the church's pastor and others, that seemed very fitting with the church's broad outlook and diverse relationships with organizations of

different faiths in the region.

Our church and its leadership are so grateful for the opportunity to be able to not only worship in the sanctuary of Temple Shir Shalom, but to also rent an office on your second floor to carry out the efforts of the church during the week. We have felt so warmly welcomed by the clergy, the staff, and the Executive Director, Brian Fishman. Members of the church have participated in projects with Temple Shir Shalom's Board of Social Action, most notably in the preparation of meals with Project NOAH and the collection

of clothing for the Oakland County Foster Closet. It is a comfortable and compatible connection for those among Pine Hill.

Thank you for your extension of hospitality. The Pine Hill Congregational Church looks forward to any ways that we might be able to partner with Temple Shir Shalom in common efforts and goals!

I recently had a realization that I wanted to share. I was in Indianapolis for the Big Ten Championship. In hindsight, I see now that visiting Israel offers the same sense of belonging to the majority. For me, one common gift in both these scenarios is the ability to temporarily set aside my inner vigilance.

This clearly underscores the motivation behind my passion for Temple Shir Shalom. On a fundamental level, Temple has allowed me to connect with Judaism and grow spiritually. But, of equal importance, and perhaps less obvious, is that Temple has offered my family an
