Our Rabbi, Our Rebbe

He remains one of Judaism's great enigmas. The rabbi mystified his generation, challenged his disciples, and has intrigued his biographers and the historians of our faith. As with other leaders, the legend and the man have merged. The more one reads about this "holy rebel," the more one wonders about him. The more one probes his personality - his manner, his thought, his system - the more one wants to know about him.

So begins Rabbi Dannel Schwartz's thesis about the Kotzker Rebbe, completed for his masters degree and rabbinical ordination. It literally fell off the shelf the other day in my office as I pulled down another book. Dannel would often say that for God there is no such thing as coincidence. That said, I didn't realize it had remained here from when Dannel switched our offices some 17 years ago. One of the many gifts he left me. Of course, I was also surprised by his descriptions of the Kotzker. He wrote these words in 1972. I'm confident some might have thought at first the description was about him - and I'm sure our rabbi would have more than enjoyed being called the "holy rebel."

As you can imagine, I've been thinking a great deal about Dannel these past weeks. His thesis didn't need to fall into my lap to bring that reality to light. Yet, it got me thinking about how he did things, the passion that burned from within for our faith and our people. Truly it was always his motivation. Good enough was never good enough. He loved to challenge. A program or an idea might have worked well in the past, but was it what we needed today? Would it carry us into the future? Some look at his success and might think it was merely about building a community. And while that was significant, for him, our community was the vehicle to bring Judaism more into our world, to help others live with the lens our faith can provide.

I can hear his voice demanding this of me, of us. Yes, he was always teaching. Personally, it was the gift he constantly shared. With me, most definitely, but through me to our congregation. My first couple years every Friday morning we would sit together and study that Shabbat's Torah portion. It was learning for the sake of learning. I miss that - so much so that we had spoken recently about doing this on zoom with each other. His insights often were nuanced and not what I expected but opened my eyes to seeing things differently. And as you'd surmise, we often wandered into tangents about Shir Shalom and what we needed to be doing, or about countless



other things. I remember sitting at a table one Friday in the office building and laughing together so loudly that others entered, concerned for what had occurred. I realized then that Dannel wanted a partner. When temple hired me, he had told everyone that Shir Shalom needed to find a rabbi right out of school, so that he could "tenderize his disciple." Together with our community, he could mold this new rabbi into looking at things uniquely, not with the expected viewpoint, as well as with some healthy irreverence. He wanted to work with someone who not only would respect him as that holy rebel but pick up where he left off. And so he made me his partner.

Of course, that's when I realized concretely that Dannel not only got things done, but had a way of getting what he wanted. I don't believe I realized then how much a blessing this would be.

Dannel gave me so much in our years together. I'm confident that this year will be filled with daily reminders of that reality. But there is no doubt, the greatest gift he shared is the community of Temple Shir Shalom. It is something I will never take for granted and will treasure all of my years. And through this, I also know that he will forever be a part of what we do here every single day.

Managing the Changes

Life is change. Seasons change. Michigan weather always changes. As adults we learn how to pivot, adjust, manage, and cope with change. Some of us make the process look seamless; others need a moment to find their way. Some changes are huge and life-changing, like becoming a new parent. Once you become a parent, dealing with children and different personalities change and shifting gears can be stressful and requires a lot of patience. Dealing with change is an ongoing life

skill. At The Learning Center we are sensitive to all the steps the young child needs to cope with change.

Research tells us that from birth to age 5 a child's brain develops more than at any other time in their life. We know that the quality of a child's experience helps shape how their brain develops. If the brain is the command center of the human body, adults must provide we lots of warm interactions, knowledge of how a child develops, understanding, predictable routines, positive experiences, appropriate boundaries, healthy foods, needed rest and plenty of hugs and kisses! That's A LOT of stuff that goes into learning how to cope with changes.

Simply put, change means different things to different kids at different ages and stages. What may seem little to us as adults may feel huge to the young child. For the young child who is planning on a playdate at a park outside and it starts to rain, that's going to take some changes. At The Learning Center we would suggest an umbrella, raincoat, and puddle boots. Someone else might cancel. How change is handled by a child's parents, teachers and loved ones plays a huge role in how a child learns to manage changes.

If the specific change is predictable then there is an opportunity to learn something about it before going through it. If you are traveling to a foreign country you want to know about the country's currency, what kinds of foods are eaten there, special places to visit, and lots of other things unique to this experience. Why not use this mindset for other changes?

Becoming a parent for the first time is a ginormous change for any human. It is hard to compare seeing the Eiffel Tower and holding a newborn baby. Ask any new parent who went through this during Covid. Ask any parent that didn't go through this during Covid! Managing the changes of parenthood is different for every new parent. After all, a child doesn't come with an owner's manual. (Actually, at The Learning Center we have been told we really understand how kids work!)

No manual? We have something better! Starting April 1, 2024, we will be offering a 7-week New Parent Series. We are looking for first time parents with babies 3 to 5 months. Meetings will be 6:00-8:00 pm. The first hour there will be a presentation on a variety of topics and the second hour you can connect with new parents. 



It's really hard to fully absorb the seemingly seismic shifts that have happened in our world since I wrote my last *Scribe* article. In case it wasn't obvious, I wrote my November/December *Scribe* installment in early October before Hamas's brutal terrorist attack on Israel. Yet, they also felt mild and resigned to our peoples' age-old struggle. Since then, my sadness, my outrage, and my fears have been amplified. Of equal importance, it offers opportunities to come together to uplift our spirits by finding joy and comfort within our Jewish community. This felt especially true, for example, at the twinkling candle filled Friday Night shabbat services this fall, the festive cocktail and food filled onegs, when I attended The March for Israel in Washington D.C. with Rabbis Mike and Daniel and fellow congregants, and at our new Women of Shir Shalom dinners where we all laughed and enjoyed the lighthearted camaraderie. With so many Shir Shalom programs, services and classes offered each month, I sincerely hope you join me by jumping into something. I feel confident that you will find something meaningful and joyful along with many friendly faces.
