

During the High Holy Days, we repeat in our liturgy the refrain that personal Repentance, Prayer and Tzedakah help ensure that we will be inscribed for good in the Book of Life in the upcoming year. Our High Holiday prayer book, known as a machzor, serves as our guide. The machzor contains the written prayers helping us reflect and reminding us of this ominous period during which we are to do an accounting of our souls.

Since we opened the doors of our sanctuary at Shir Shalom, we have used the Reform Movement's *Gates of Repentance*, "the red book," first published in 1978, to create meaningful services with beauty and depth. As our movement evolved with more gender inclusive language, the machzor was edited and reprinted in 1996 to reflect that ideology. This is why in our sanctuary you will sometimes hear different words recited – even though you believed you were in the right place.

For these reasons and more, I am excited to share, that after many discussions and with the approval of Temple's Board of Directors, this upcoming September, we will be the first congregation in Metro Detroit to begin using the Reform Movement's new *machzor*, *Mishkan HaNefesh*, "Sanctuary of the Soul."

We hope you will find, as we have found, contemporary language which leads you to meaningful words of praise, petition, thanksgiving and reflection; that you will find consistency in what is being read or sung from the bimah to your own machzor; and that you will find updated translations and poetry allowing for a fresh perspective on your personal introspection.

We know that some thrive on change while others prefer tradition, because, after all, change can be difficult. As you enter the Sanctuary for the High Holy Days in September, we want you to know that you will still hear the same sacred music sung by Cantor Penny and the choir; you will still recite the traditional liturgy that Jewish communities around the world will be reading; you will still hear sermons which provide food for thought; you will still have opportunities to learn and grow; and you will continue to experience meaningful services with beauty and depth.

To help transition to our new machzor, in the upcoming months, we will feature highlights of the new prayer book in each *Scribe*. For those interested, we will also offer classes on the evolution of liturgy and our new prayer book. And, we will have copies available in the office for those who would like to get a sneak peek.

As we begin this secular New Year, when many focus their resolutions on keeping their bodies healthy, I look forward to a year in which we will able to focus on keeping our souls healthy as we transition from 5780 to 5781. Wishing you a Happy and Healthy New Year!

She was easy to spot because she attended the service with a mask over her face as she had recently undergone her transplant surgery. She is doing amazing now and we all got to meet her truly selfless donor, Kristi.

Shortly after that, we held a different kind of special Shabbat: Tacos and Tequila. Unfortunately, I was out of town and had to miss it, but I am told that a good time was had by all.

I share these three with you for a couple of reasons. First, if you missed any or all of them, maybe a little taste of what you missed will get you to the next one. Not only is the content worthwhile, it is a great way for you to meet your fellow members that make up our outstanding community. Also, I want to reinforce the variety of topics/themes that can be incorporated to make the Shabbat service even more enjoyable.

## Not As You Knew It

The religious school I attended was three days a week and quite serious. There were times when we could maybe color, but it was mostly desk work and Hebrew drills. Today religious schools look extremely different and SHORESH is no exception. Our program follows a camp model, allowing students to learn through activities, experiential learning and many opportunities to see the world through a Jewish lens.

Did you know that SHORESH is a weekly program that meets on Sundays? Did you know that 287 students walk through our door each week? Did you know that there are 60 Machonikim, classroom aides, each Sunday at Hillel? And do you know all the things that happen at SHORESH?

On Sunday mornings grades PK–6 learn though play, activity, experiences and stories. A visit from a petting zoo helped us learn about kindness to animals and about some of the animals that Noah carried on the Ark. We made dog cookies for Detroit Dog Rescue. Students in grades 4–6 made winter scarves for the homeless as they learned about random acts of kindness. Fourth graders made their own mezzuzot with the help of artist Teri Barkin. First graders not only made their own Shabbat rituals, candlesticks, challah and grape juice, but they came together and practiced Shabbat as a community at Temple.

Sunday afternoons are filled with activities for our seventh and eighth grade students. This fall our students participated in J-Serve and helped our community by raking leaves at a JARC home and a home of a senior citizen. Participating on a retreat with Musician in Residence Alan Goodis was a highlight for all!

Our Sunday nights are alive, energetic and engaging for students in grades 9–12. Some of the highlights from this fall included making flying wish paper from tea bags to send our transgressions up in the air for *Tashlich* to making our own chocolate balls, an Israeli treat, while learning about Israel from Tamar, our Israeli who is matched to Temple through the Shinshinim program. Forty-three of our high school students visited New York City and experienced it through a Jewish lens. The National Alliance on Mental Illness provided pertinent programs for our high school students and their parents.

It is only January and there is so much more to come. SHORESH stands strong and mighty on Sunday!

Remember to mark your calendars for two special dates. **January 19** we will be hosting our annual Tikkun Olam-a-thon at Temple. Opportunities to sign up and to be part of our amazing morning of service will be available shortly. **February 2** we will host our first Superbowl party at Langan's Nor-West Lanes. - FOLLOW THROUGH OK I may be cute but when I get older, I may not be this cute. I am going to make mistakes now, even get into "preschool" trouble and helping me now will help me later.
- **READ MY CUES** I try hard to tell you what is on my mind. When I don't have words, I am showing you in other ways. It's kind of like playing charades.
- SLOW DOWN I can see it's not easy being a mom or dad! I can be so confusing sometimes. If you could slow down and look at things through my eyes and not always hurry through everything, I might not be so confusing.
- PUT DOWN YOUR PHONE I love when we Facetime with Nana. I love seeing videos of me when I was little. But when you're on the phone all the time I feel left out and not important. Sometimes that's when I act out to get your attention.
- SEND ME TO THE LEARNING CENTER Mom and Dad, I hope I didn't hurt your feelings. I was just letting you know what the research is saying about kids. There is a place that really knows about how we learn. It's called Temple Shir Shalom's Preschool: The Learning Center. They are now taking applications for Summer Camp AND Fall


# Temple Now Accepts Jewelry Donations with New Program
