born. Of course holding your finger on the button for 10 seconds was onerous, so now it's automatic. It's just the seeming trend toward convenience which we gravitate to in many of our lives, in countless different ways.

Interesting that the same has taken hold with our faith. And yes, there are certain opportunities in which I relish the convenience we've created. Who would have thought that we could connect with so many through services online? It has become a blessing for a good number who might not have found it possible to get to experience Shabbat.

Yet there are times in which the time commitment, the personal connections in which we invest, far exceed what we might expect. For

us at Temple Shir Shalom, we see this every Sunday evening with our high school students. These teens, on some level, similar to what generations have done before, have chosen to invest their time with one another, to engage in study, to evaluate the world we live in and will live in, through a Jewish lens. Six years ago, I was invited to teach first grade at SHORESH while finishing my time at Repair the World as Team Leader of my cohort. I was so excited to spend my Sunday mornings with my students and Machonikim that I never realized I was getting the attention of others. One Sunday, a high school student named Jordan Robinson walked up to me and said he thought I would be a great youth group advisor and should apply for the new job opening at Temple. I didn't really know Jordan yet but was so flattered that in the limited time he'd seen me around SHORESH he thought I would be a positive influence on the program. Not to mention that after two years with teens in PeersCorps, I realized I wasn't done working with the age group and had more to offer. I knew in my heart this was the job for me and got my application in as fast as I could. I went

into the interview with a clear mission statement: for our teens to be well rounded, critical-thinking individuals that go off to college continuing to seek Jewish experiences. A few months later, I was hired! Not only was my mother now empowered to brag to the degree that you would think I got a job at NASA, but I felt instant gratitude to be part of this community.

Over the past five years as the Teen Engagement Director, I have been able to work with so many of your kids at different points in their development. Back-to-back programming on Sundays, spending the mornings at SHORESH working with our Machonikim and getting to know our younger students, lunch time with Madrichim and evenings with the SSTY board and SSTY'ites

at Sunday Night School, made sure that I had unique experiences with every age group. We were lucky enough to travel to New York, Cincinnati and DC (twice) and all make it home safe and sound, regardless of broken-down buses or flights that circled aimlessly in the air while waiting for a gate to fly into. We grew the Purim Carnival and introduced two special interest group gatherings this year based on Feminism and the LGBTQ+ community.

I wrote in one of my first

Scribe articles, "For every minute I sit behind a desk (at The Corners) I am rewarded with exciting retreats, SSTY events, deep conversations at Sunday Night School and every other opportunity I am given to spend time with them." So much has changed over the years but that has stayed the same. Thank you for sharing your children with me. I have cherished every moment with them. We have grown together in ways I couldn't imagine. When my mom passed away, it was their hugs, love and support that helped make me feel closer to being myself again. When COVID-19 hit, it was their zoom calls and late-night phone calls that gave me purpose to think outside of myself and personal challenges. And, even now, it is their confidence in me

that helps me feel ready to take my next steps in this world professionally and emotionally. I can only hope that I have provided the same support and security for their development as well.

This has been such a wonderful place to work. The team here is small but mighty and truly has everyone's best interest at heart. Thank you to the Rabbis for guiding me and making sure everything we put out for the teens was a success. A special thank you to Andee who has been my dream mentor, my work mom, and everything in between. I could not have asked for anyone better to advocate for me and advise me. I have learned so much from you and am eternally grateful. Also, thank you Jordan for suggesting me for this position all those years ago. It is a reminder that all the teens I have met in this position are the reason I fell in love with this job and made it worthwhile.






