Want It. Find It. We All Need It.

Why is it that there are so many lessons one can glean in a grocery store? Or is that just me. On a late Sunday afternoon with the quick run to pick up a few items fleshing out that night's dinner, the wisdom imparted is both poignant 18 months into a pandemic, and relevant, as we enter our season of repentance.

It seems this time the wrong check out line had been chosen (you might remember that sermon). With few options open due to an apparent cashier shortage, I found myself five deep from the start and the line was growing. Yet something

was different, unexpected. The energy surrounding us actually felt calm. No one seemed antsy or irritated. We merely waited. And then the reason for the delay was noticed – the young man bagging the groceries was having a particularly difficult time. He couldn't get everything to fit in the bag. Exasperated he exclaimed, "it won't fit! It just can't." The cashier helped him, showing him how they could figure it out together and he began to relax. A smile crept across his face. The shoppers in front of

me took their groceries as the young man apologized all the while that they assured him that it wasn't an inconvenience in the least bit.

Why is it that we're surprised when patience guided this intimate community of strangers. If only this didn't strike us as astounding, even extraordinary. I'm sure some genuinely were rushed and inconvenienced, a few with anxious children, maybe another who needed to finish a task for work. But in those few moments, something seemingly remarkable occurred – and something we need to bring more into our world.

The Hebrew word for patience is *savlanut*. Interesting that the root of this word is saval, meaning to bear a heavy

burden, even to suffer. How much that meaning can teach us. Real patience takes work and at times possibly even suffering. It isn't necessarily in our nature to wait, to suspend our immediate need for satisfaction and to have something completed. Most importantly, real patience means putting aside our own wishes for the sake of another. Our faith teaches that this is the work we must do. Actually the Mussar masters (a virtue based approach to Jewish ethics developed in the 19th century) suggested that we must train our souls with patience.

As we enter our holiest time of the year, we are told that these are the days in which we must take an accounting of our souls, a heshbon hanefesh. No coincidence I'm sure that one of the earlier Mussar Rabbis, Menachem Mendel Lefin actually titled his book Heshbon HaNefesh and in it wrote, "When something bad happens to you and you did not have the power to avoid it, do not aggravate the situation even more through wasted grief."

There's a lot packed in that line – the energy we expend doing just that, what we end up making worse. Truth is I'm not the most patient individual. Hopefully though I'm learning. The daily changing realties of our covid world have helped some realize the value in not rushing through so much and appreciating the value even in what might slow us down. Those extra moments in the grocery store truly became a reminder of what matters most - and from that, a blessing. As my few purchased items casually strolled down the conveyer, the young man was back in his rhythm. Then he stretched his arms out wide and exclaimed, "what a day. Phew, I'm almost done!." Again, he smiled. As he handed me my groceries, he lifted up his hand to give me a high five and without realizing my hand slapped his back (breaking my hand touching covid protocol, though it seemed worth it). Then he yelled, "we did it. We did it together."

Yes we did. And I know that when I'm frustrated and my patience is waning, I'm going to circle back to this as such an important lesson for our new year.

So much has changed in those months. We have been consulting with our Covid Task Force on a regular basis and it has been like a roller coaster with good news and not so good news. We try to spin it in the most positive direction.

We recognized that like last year, the celebration of the holidays will be different this year. There will be members who stay home because they are cautious. There will be members who don't come to Temple for services because it is more convenient to roll out of bed, pour a cup of coffee and watch services in their pajamas. There will be people who appreciate the fact that they can enjoy services from home without worrying about parking, getting dressed up or where they were going to sit. And there will be people sitting in the sanctuary, fully engaged in the service because the holidays aren't the holidays unless they are at Temple. We are good with all of it.

If the last year and a half has taught us anything, we know the importance of making a plan that contains the critical element of flexibility. We are also going

to require masks for everyone for indoor services which happens to be the same policy at all of the local temples and synagogues. It is quite amazing how quickly all of those organizations got on the same page.

And then there is Rabbi Mike's 25/26/27th Anniversary Weekend that follows right behind the holidays on the first weekend in October. It is even tougher to predict what things will be like because it is further away. We are going to make sure that it is the best event that we can have (while possibly having to remain a little flexible) for this welldeserved celebration.

Finally, I have to give a big THANK YOU to Audrey Bloomberg and Mel Pohl for all of their hard work and dedication as they move into their next chapters. Audrey was at Temple for over 5 years and has accepted a job as the Regional Director for Michigan Region BBYO. I am very excited that she has this wonderful opportunity and wish her continued success. Mel has been here for what seems like forever - over 15 years! If you have ever been in the Temple office, you probably know Mel and she probably knows you. I wish her only good things moving forward and she will not be a stranger as her family will remain as members. Both have been tremendous assets to Temple and will certainly be missed.

The Days of Awe, Everyday

"All grown-ups were once children... but only few of them remember it."

The Little Prince, Antoine de Saint-Exupéry.

As I write this article there are children running around the playground in bathing suits. Their laughter is contagious as they rejoice in the coolness of the water from the sprinkler. For preschoolers every day is a new adventure; they look at the world in awe everyday...and there's that word "awe." With the holiday of Rosh Hashanah just weeks away I can't help but notice what else will follow. Rosh Hashanah commemorates the creation of the world. It marks the beginning of the Days of Awe, a 10 day period of introspection and repentance that culminates in Yom Kippur, also known as the Day of Atonement.

What do these religious holidays have to do with preschoolers? It is more the feel of what these holidays represents that connects with the processes of the young child. We celebrate the birthday of the world on Rosh Hashanah, a new beginning of a new year. For the young child every day is a new beginning. They wake up in the morning and, guaranteed, they will discover some new adventure. Their problem-solving skills are still developing and there is always a sense of wonder within their world.

For the child that attends The Learning Center the development of introspection is an ongoing process. Preschoolers by nature are egocentric. The world centers on them. This is how the preschooler is wired. Our job as their caregivers is to take note of their wiring and help them in the process self-regulation and the beginning awareness of what they bring to the community. How do they impact others? By understanding the individual child we help them become more successful in the group.

The act of atonement, making amends, is a huge gift that our preschoolers learn at The Learning Center. I call it the power of repair. Again, another process. Young children are just learning how to get along with others. Some make mistakes and some can be intentional. Having them revisit the issue, their friend, and checking on this other child is a big step in taking responsibility for their actions. Just think: they are doing this all the years that they are at preschool, not just for 10 days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

As the High Holidays approach and we are gathering together physically again, I feel extremely grateful for both how our clergy and Temple staff pivoted to virtual programming to keep us connected over the past 18 months and for the beautiful Temple at the corner of Walnut and Orchard Lake that many of us remember being built.

The Temple was never actually completed as it was originally imagined and designed by Rabbi Dannel Schwartz and the architects. Now that we are returning to our physical home for study, prayer and coming together for the joy of special occasions, I was excited to be asked to be the Chairperson for the Project All Together Capital Campaign. Paying off the mortgage will allow Rabbis Mike and Daniel to use more of our dues and donations for Temple programming, education and social action and make the Temple fiscally sound for all of our families for decades to come.


