A Message from Rabbi Rabishaw

Dearest TOR Community,

Rabbi Lawrence Kushner famously tells a story about a time he brought a preschool school class into the Temple sanctuary for a special tour with the rabbi. He showed them the bimah (the stage-like area where he led services), the ner tamid (the eternal light), and then finally, the aron hakodesh (the holy ark).

"What do you suppose is in there?" he asked them.

"Nothing!" one child answered, "It's empty."

"A new car!" another shouted.

"A Torah!" responded another.

"I know! I know," one child insisted, "It's a mirror!"

While "a Torah" was technically the correct response, Rabbi Kushner was most impressed by the child who answered "it's a mirror." Kushner would later teach: for those who are prepared to look deeply and imaginatively, the ark contains a mirror, reflecting the truth about ourselves, our values, our accomplishments and our limitations.

As we look towards the new year of 5784 and anticipate the CONNECTIONS that we will make here at Temple Or Rishon, I invite you to look in the mirror and think about what you want for yourself, your family and your community. My hope is that TOR and all the engagement that is possible with our Temple community will inspire you to get involved, discover deeper truth about yourself, live your values, experience new accomplishments, and rise above your limitations.

Details about the High Holy Days

High Holy Day Tickets: TOR members in good standing will receive personalized electronic tickets via email before September 5th. In order to ensure a safe worship environment we ask that you bring them with you to our High Holy Days services. Tickets can be printed or shown on your mobile device.

Arrival and Parking: All services will start on time. There will be ushers available to help you find a seat should you arrive late. Please remember that there are no reserved seats except for a few seats in the front that are set aside for service participants. Additional parking is available at The Life Center on Creek Oaks Lane, across from TOR. If you can manage the short walk from the church, help us leave TOR parking for those who must park close because of disability or other compelling reasons. Parking is not permitted on Creek Oaks Lane because it is a private road.

Security: TOR will employ our regular security guards and off duty Sheriffs to help keep our High Holy Days services safe and secure. These officers will be present throughout our gatherings. Your cooperation with tickets and parking will help ensure a safe environment.

An introduction to the language of Judaism for the times and seasons of human experience. An intimate group of families learning and practicing Judaism together.

This program will include learning and discussion sessions at Temple Or Rishon during Hebrew school hours, and celebration and practice in the homes of cohort members. This project is aimed at people seeking knowledge of Jewish practice and worldview as experienced through the Jewish year, as well as practical knowledge of how to make that happen.
