Honeyed Challah and Apple Pudding

- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 3 apples, peeled, cored and coarsely chopped
- 2 ½ cups milk
- ¾ cup honey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 5 cups challah torn in small pieces
- 4 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 tablespoons sugar

Step 1

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place 2 tablespoons butter in a 9-inch square baking dish and place in the oven until the butter melts. When the butter has melted, remove the pan from the oven and use a brush to coat the bottom and sides evenly with the melted butter.

Step 2

While the oven is preheating and the butter melting, heat the remaining butter in a heavy skillet, add the apples and sauté over high heat until they just begin to soften and take on color, about 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and set aside.

Step 3

Mix the milk, honey and vanilla together in a large bowl. Add the challah pieces and allow to soak about 10 minutes, until the milk is well absorbed. Beat the eggs until frothy, mix them with the challah, sautéed apples and half the cinnamon.

Step 4

Transfer the mixture to the baking dish. Mix the remaining cinnamon with the sugar and sprinkle over the top. Bake about 45 minutes. Serve warm or at room temperature.

A Ritual Worthy of Review: Tashlikh

During Rosh Hashanah, in the ceremony called Tashlikh, Jews traditionally go to the river or any body of water to pray and throw breadcrumbs into the water. Some empty their pockets. We read from the book of the prophet Micah verses about teshuva. Symbolically, the fish devour our sins. This year is different because we won't be gathering as a community at the Guy West Bridge over the American River to toss our sins into the water as a community. We have to do it differently.

In the new year 2020 / 5781 when thinking out of the box in this new normal it is important that our Jewish traditions, customs, ceremonies, and rituals be looked at through this new lens.

Here are some ideas for Tashlich 5782:

We are blessed with a bounty of water bodies in the Sacramento area - the Sacramento River, the American River, Folsom Lake, and a myriad of canals and streams. It shouldn't be too difficult to find one and symbolically toss your sins into the water.

If that doesn't work, if you have an aquarium, toss a few crumbs of fish food and recite the readings for Tashlich found in the Machzor.

One could conduct a water balloon toss. With every toss think of a sin and toss it away.

One author describes how it's done in Jerusalem, "Jerusalem isn't blessed with many rivers. Although we have several wadis that serve as the runoff for untreated sewage, it's just not the same. So Jerusalemites have to be more creative. People stand at the bottom of water tanks, on the hills above swimming pools, beside their kitchen sinks or above sealed pits that legend says used to be wells."

Thankfully we have rivers surrounding us!

There's the old joke about people asking what kind of bread crumbs do we throw for specific sins and misbehaviors. Here's one such list

For telling bad jokes/puns - Corn Bread

For raising your voice too often - Challah

For abrasiveness - Grits

For silliness - Nut Bread

For sins committed in haste - Matzoh

For complex sins - Multigrain

For sins of indecision - Waffles
