## The Jewish St. Pat



Rabbi Dr. Scott B. Saulson

Ninety years ago, at a St. Patrick's Day dinner of a local church, Rabbi Dr. Bernard Heller, director of the University of Michigan Hillel, referred to Saint Patrick as "the Moses of the Irish." Unlike Paddy, Moish was not a miracle worker. On the contrary, his exclusion for the Passover Haggadah reminds us that miracles, such as they are, ought be attributed solely to the Creator.

This is not to say that saints are unknown to Jewish tradition and veneration. Our mystical tradition asserts that 36 such individuals exist in every generation, none of whom are known to anyone. Moreover, without these 36 extraordinarily righteous individuals human civilization would revert to a dog-eat-dog jungle. (Given the state of world affairs, it might not be a stretch to conclude that there are fewer than three dozen of these special individuals currently alive and well.)

The key qualification for Jewish sainthood was proffered by Rabbi Judah, leading scholar of the 2nd century rabbinic community of Palestine. Not only must our saints be Jewishly knowledgeable and ethical, they must be quite determined not to do an injury or cause damage to others – Jew or non-Jew. In a way, they must go beyond the "letter of the law".

As for a long history of venerating Jewish saints – such veneration can be traced to a mixture of superstition and a personal sense of unworthiness. Out of this mixture arose a need for intercessors, individuals, dead or living, who could advocate our case before the Throne of Glory. Advocates minus "Esq."

Yet, fundamentally, sainthood is far from a stretch for the simply sane. Joshua ben Perahyah, also of the 2nd century, supplies the tool kit: Find a mentor, make a friend, and give people the benefit of the doubt.

#### **Winter Clothing Drive**

Thanks to everyone who contributed to the clothing drive. Four carloads of warm winter clothing were brought to the Christian Center. Thanks so much to Judy Gitelson for her help.

#### **Winter Fuel Assistance Drive**

Thanks to everyone who contributed to this drive. We raised \$2,548. This money will be donated evenly between the fuel assistance programs at Elder Services of Berkshire County and the Pittsfield Area Council of Congregations (PACC).

### **Berkshire County Diaper Project Drive**

This March and April, the Social Action Committee will have a drive to support the Berkshire County Diaper Project (BCDP). Diaper need can cause significant depression in parents and potential health and mental issues for their children. Low-income families frequently struggle to buy diapers, which cost more than \$100 per month per child. Diapers are not covered by the WIC Program, the federal program supporting low income earning women and their children up to age 5; nor by SNAP, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, otherwise known as food stamps. Without a supply of disposable diapers provided by parents, infants and toddlers are not allowed to attend daycare. Without daycare, parents cannot work to provide diapers and other essentials.

All funds go directly toward purchasing diapers for babies and toddlers in need. The diapers are distributed throughout Berkshire County to sites including the South Congregational Church, the Elizabeth Freeman Center, the Family Center of North Berkshire

County, the Family Resource Center in Gt. Barrington, Manos Unidos, Jewish Family Services for refugee families, Gladys Allen Brigham Center, and all three WIC offices. Since BCDP's inception in September 2014, 2 million diapers have been given away.

You can either send a monetary donation or drop off diapers. Please send all checks to the TAA office. The checks can be made out to TAA indicating on the memo section that the check is for BCDP. BCDP is able to purchase diapers at a marked discount. Diapers, including open packages, can be dropped off at TAA.


