# From the Rabbi's Desk: Belief In One Another



Anne Frank's house is a very popular destination in Amsterdam. Unlike other tourist sites, Anne Frank House tickets cannot be purchased on line. To gain entrance, you wait in an unusually long queue until you reach the ticket window and interact directly with the seller. Upon

Entering the house, you climb to the attic and discover tiny rooms void of furniture. Anne's father Otto Frank did not want the house to become a site where visitors might be tempted to sit at the table or scrutinize a couch. Based on facts, he wanted the experience to be spun from each person's heart. The vacant rooms with detailed murals speak volumes about the individuals who silently lived within the walls and the virulent world outside.



Outside the Anne Frank house is the serene canal called the Prinsengracht. All the narrow streets are packed with pedestrians, bicycle riders, and impatient cars. Eyes soak in the decorative tulips reclining on picturesque bridges. Around the corner from the Anne Frank House is a crowded world-famous pancake restaurant. It is difficult to conceive how such an innocent bustling exterior world once contained such secret suffering.

There in the cramped attic, scarcely able to look out the window for fear of being discovered Anne wrote in her diary. From 1942-1944, her pen drew messages that were imminent to her existence and somehow still relevant today. She wrote:

"In the long run, the sharpest weapon of all is a kind and gentle spirit."

"As long as this exists, this sunshine and this cloudless sky, and as long as I can enjoy it, how can I be sad?"

"I don't want to have lived in vain like most people. I want to be useful or bring enjoyment to all people, even those I've never met. I want to go on living even after my death!"

It is now 2018. In our community, we have freedom to live our lives as Jews and as Americans. Our country permits us to take time off from work and from school to observe our holiest of days. Rather than fearing police, they guard our well-being.

While far from perfect, our lives are paradise in contrast to those who lived in fear and perished. Albeit midweek High Holidays are more difficult than when they fall during the weekend, we are blessed to live here and now.

"How wonderful it is that nobody need wait a single moment before starting to improve the world."

Our Jewish high holidays begin Saturday, September 1<sup>st</sup> with Selichot and continue until Monday, October 1<sup>st</sup> with Simchat Torah. For all those who longed to celebrate but could not, we carry their hopes with us into the future.

Shanah Tovah u'Metukah, wishing you a good and sweet New Year.

## Vayikra (Leviticus): A Call to Holiness



Chosen by the Rabbinic sages as the first book to initiate children to Bible learning, contemporary readers often perceived Vayikra as inaccessible. Yet, embedded in the laws that focus on the

prescribed sacrificial practices, laws of ritual impurity and purity, and the pursuit of holiness are messages and values that have relevance to the universal condition. In our study of Vayikra, we will examine themes including the role of rituals, responding to tragedy, confronting birth and parenthood, seeking forgiveness, balancing the place of the individual and the community, bringing sanctity into one's daily life, and more. Through a textual study of selected passages, this course uncovers the depth and wisdom of the third book of the Torah and reveals its enduring messages that touch our lives to this very day.

## The Star and the Crescent: The Long Relationship of Judaism and Islam



Jews and Muslims have co-existed for more than a millennium. What do they have in common? What are the sources of tension and conflict between Judaism and Islam? Although there were moments

of strife, during the first thousand years after the founding of Islam it was better to be Jewish in a Muslim country than in a Christian country. Only after that period did the relationship between Jews and Muslims deteriorate, particularly in the Middle East. Outside the Middle East, though, Jews and Muslims continue to find ways to coexist peacefully and often productively. This course will examine the longstanding relationship between Judaism and Islam, between Jews and Muslims, broadening our understanding and challenging our assumptions.


