My Two Shekels

I am looking forward to celebrating my 10 years with Congregation Beth Shalom in just a few weeks. I can't believe how fast this decade has gone, and how much has happened, both in my own life and within this congregation! I'll be sharing my thoughts with you on that next month when we come together again for the High Holy Days. In the meantime, I wanted to share with you this blast from the past: my very first HaShomer Article, written 10 years ago this month. Enjoy!



Our children were very young when we moved to Texas 16 years ago. Our youngest was six months, and our oldest was beginning kindergarten at the Fort Worth Hebrew Day School.

I remember waking up in our new home that first morning, going outside to get the paper on what was probably a 100 degree day, and thinking, "What are we doing here?" My husband is a native New Yorker, I'm a Chicagoan, and we had lived the last eight years of our lives in Los Angeles.

There was only one bagel place here at that time, and the men painting our house told us they didn't even know what a bagel was. I had three children under the age of six, no family here, and no decent bagels. How would we survive?

Much has changed over the past 16 years. Our youngest will be a Senior in high school, and our oldest will be graduating college. The Fort Worth Hebrew Day School no longer exists, but I can finally find decent bagels (although I no longer eat them, because now that I'm 16 years older, I've got to watch my carb intake.)

And professionally, I am beginning a new chapter in my life, as I move ever closer to earning the title of Cantor, and stepping up on the Bimah in August to lead you in prayer. And although this marks another new chapter in the life of Congregation Beth Shalom, I feel that I'm just another link in the chain of its history, because although I'm a new face to many of you, I also have a 16 year history with Beth Shalom.

I have been privileged to have had a unique relationship with each of your former Rabbis. **Rabbi Stern** helped me co-lead a service I developed many years ago called Minyan Mishpacha This was a travelling family service that rotated between our three area synagogues on a monthly basis. In fact, back in December of 1996, the Star-Telegram did a full page article on the service, complete with a large picture of Rabbi Stern holding up the Torah, with about 100 children and adults watching in awe.

When **Rabbi Kaye** and his family came to town, we became fast friends. Our children all attended the day school together, and we were in the same Havurah. When they left, their oldest son Ilan flew down for our son Jeremy's Bar Mitzvah.

This is something that our Security Committee will discuss and determine if there is any outreach we can do in the future.

Although we are still in good financial health, we did not meet all of our financial goals. One of the ways we achieve these goals is by our members support through their fair share commitment. You may recall that this is the company that initially koshered our scrolls in February 2016. In the image below, you will note **Rabbi Menachem Bialo** carefully inspecting one of our scrolls while on our campus June 5th. The fact that this occurred just a few days before Shavuot made this process that much more meaningful to me.



As I am writing this article in early July, I am hopeful that the promised improvements to Gan Shalom have been addressed and the lack of drainage issues that previously existed, are no more. You will recall receiving an email letter (also in early July) laying out the action plan and timeline for these improvements to occur. Below you will note the entrance to our section, now landscaped with edging and crushed granite with the shrubbery neatly trimmed.

The Ritual Committee recently met to designate honors for the upcoming High Holy Days. Please be on the lookout soon for an email letter if you received an honor, responding promptly if you can accept, or allowing enough time to find a replacement if not.
