It is these dreams that will ensure a brighter tomorrow for generations to come.

Now, I stand before you and pledge my undying commitment to never forget the past - but I also pledge my unending commitment to ensure Jewish continuity.

Chevra Shaas Words From Rabbi Menahem White AHAREI MOT 5782

First of all, in the name of Chevra Shaas, we send our condolences to Ron Mashaal on the loss of his father; and to Rev. Hazzan Benlolo, on the loss of his sister. May their memories be for a blessing. min ha-shamayim tenuhamu!

This past Thursday, 27 Nisan according to the Jewish calendar, was Yom Ha-Shoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day. Is there a connection to Pesach (15-22 Nisan)?

Well, yes. For the Passover story begins with Pharaoh decreeing that all Israelite baby boys should be killed. A great role model for the Nazis ym"sh. But there might be something even more.

Towards the beginning of the hagada,

we refer to the words arami 'oved 'avi, from the Book of Deuteronomy. Those words are usually translated "my father was a wandering Aramaean," referring either to Abraham or to Jacob. Yet the ancient and authoritative Aramaic translation, known as Targum Ongelos, translates "Lavan the Aramaean wanted to destroy my father [Jacob.] And it is obvious that the author of the hagadah follows the approach of Ongelos, for we recite towards the beginning of the hagada, "Go and learn, what Lavan the Aramaean intended to do to our father Jacob. For Pharaoh decreed the destruction of only the males, whereas Lavan wanted to root out the whole nation."

What!!!?? Whom did he want to eradicate? Besides Jacob, he would have destroyed his 2 daughters, and his 12 grandchildren (11 boys, 1 girl: Benjamin hadn't been born yet.) Why was he so mad at Jacob? Well, Jacob had been working for him as a shepherd. It seems that Jacob had been extremely successful as a breeder. Finally, Jacob, with full

agreement of his wives, runs away, together with his wives and children.

What did Lavan say? "the girls (i.e. the wives) are MINE, the children are MY children, the sheep are MY sheep, and whatever you see is MINE. And I would have harmed you, had I not had a dream in which your God told me not to harm you."

According to this interpretation, Lavan is the role model for antisemites throughout history. Persecuted Jews come into a land (as Jacob was running from Esau,) become very successful, bring wealth and culture into their adopted country, and then are despised for their success.

And that's why we say in the hagadah: "in every generation they try to destroy us, but the Holy One Blessed be He saves us from them." And that's why we appreciate the great miracle of 5 iyyar, coming this week!!

Jewish Wisdom

Yom Ha'Atzmaut

There is a wide variety of ways in which Jewish communities religiously commemorate Israel's Independence Day, many involving special prayers for the day. The following article from 'My Jewish Learning' surveys some customs that have developed since the founding of the state in 1948.

While not widely adopted in the Diaspora, special liturgies [of Yom Ha'atzmaut] are fairly common in Israel, where government leaders regularly attend the festive prayer services. The one for the evening, designed by Israel's Chief Rabbinate in 1949, begins with psalms of thanksgiving (Psalms 107, 97, 98) and ends with a single blast of a shofar and a prayer that as we have witnessed the beginning of redemption, we will also merit hearing the shofar announcing the

Some also read the Torah (Deuteronomy 7:1-8:18, describing what would happen after the Israelites entered the Land, or Deuteronomy 30:1-10, about being returned to the Land after exile and misfortune). A prayer for the welfare of the State of Israel, one in memory of those fallen, prayers for Jerusalem, and a Zion Lover's Prayer have also been added to services, along with the song expressing belief in the coming of the messiah, "Ani Ma' amin.

Communities around the world have added their own touches. An announcement of the number of years since the establishment of the state prior to sounding the shofar at the evening service is modeled on the Yemenite Tisha B'Av custom of proclaiming the number of years since the destruction of the Temple

A Tikkun L 'Yom Ha'atzmaut, an anthology of readings and prayers (parts of Kabbalat Shabbat, Shema, Leshanah Haba B'Yerusha/ayim, Shir Hama' alotperhaps sung to the tune of Israel's national anthem—and Ani Ma'amin), is used by some Moroccan and other congregations for Arvit and Shacharit.

Thoughts: Mayer Sasson - ACHAREI MOT - SHABBAT MEVARCHIM "Clinging to G-d"

"And G-d spoke to Moses after the death of the two sons of Aharon; it was in their coming near before G-d..."

In one verse the Torah mentions "after the death of the two sons of Aharon" and immediately thereafter goes into the details of Laws pertaining to the Service of the Cohen Gadol on Yom Kippur. The holy Or Hachaim asks: The Torah described the death of Aharon's sons in great detail in the Parsha of Shmini and it said they "offered strange fire before G-d". What does the Torah want to teach us in this verse?

We know that the Rabbis said that Nadav and Avihu – why were they hit by a divine fire? Because they had drunk, they were not married, they stated the Law before their teacher, they offered a strange fire that G-d had not ordered – and there are other things said about them. G-d forbid, they committed so many sins? One was not enough? This shows that all the things mentioned were not enough of a justification for them to die and their death is not explained.

The holy Or Hachaim says that in this Parsha the Torah reveals to us why they died. And this explains the words "by them that are near to Me will I be sanctified". How did Moshe Rabeinu console Aharon HaCohen? Moshe said – "Now I remember that G-d told me con-

cerning the work in the Mishkan, he said "by them that are near to Me will I be sanctified". On that day the Divine Presences will dwell in Israel, the Mishkan will be built – by them that are near to me will I be sanctified. And I thought – who are those that are near to G-d? Either you or me. And now I see that they are greater than me and you. "By them that are near to Me will I be sanctified."

The holy Or Hachaim says that the righteous always day with "kiss of death". Not through the Angel of Death, not from external reasons of This World.
