Kids' Shabbat

PARASHAT BESHALAH - SHABBAT SHIRA OUR YOUTHFUL SYNAGOGUE... By: Julia Peress Rosenfeld

First Aliyah: Pharaoh kicked the Jewish people out of Egypt. G d did not allow them to take any shortcuts as he worried, they would run into their enemies. G d then commanded the Israelites to setup a camp along the Red Sea. This way the Egyptians would assume that the Jewish people were lost and would come looking for them. The Jewish people did as they were told and Egyptians armies went out looking for them.

Second Aliyah: The Jewish people noticed the Egyptian armies coming, and they panicked. They screamed at



Moses who told them not to worry. "Don't be afraid," Moses said "Stand firm and see G d's salvation that he will wreak for you today . . . G d will fight for you,"

Third Aliyah: G d told Moses, "Speak to the children of Israels and let them travel!" G d then told Moses to extend his staff. He did and the sea divided, the Israelites walked on the seabed, on

dry land. The Egyptians followed them into the sea.

Fourth Aliyah: Moses stretched his hand over the sea and the waters that had been standing like walls, fell on the Egyptians, drowning them all. Moses led the Jewish people in song, praising G d for the miracle that had taken place. Miriam, Moses' sister, led the women in song and dance. The Jewish people continued their journey, they were hoping to find water but didn't. When they arrived in Marah, they finally found water—but it was bitter. Moses sweetened the water, it was a miracle!

Fifth Aliyah: One month after leaving Egypt, the Israelites' ran out of food. They complained to Moses, mentioning nostalgically "the comforts of Egypt," that they left behind. G d responded that he will rain down bread from heaven in the mornings, and meat will be provided every night.



Sixth Aliyah: The meat appeared in the evening. In the morning, bread - called manna - fell from heaven. Moses told the Israelites gather one omer of manna household member every day. No matter how much manna one picked,

they arrived home with exactly one omer per person. On Friday everyone picked two omers. Moses explained that the second portion was to be prepared and set aside for Shabbat—when no manna would fall.

Seventh Aliyah: The Jewish people kept walking and when they arrived in Rephidim their drinking water ran out again. The Israelites complained, and G d told Moses to hit a rock with his staff. Water came pouring out of the rock and the people drank. The Amalekites then came and attacked the Jewish people. Moses told his student Joshua to assemble an army to fight. Joshua did so, and the Jewish people won—helped by Moses' prayer atop a mountain.

Words From Rabbi Menahem White Beshalah 5783

Dear mitpallelim: I am writing from my son's house in Boca. I miss Chevra Shaas and all my Montreal friends very much, but I can't say that I miss the snow and cold temperatures.

Benai yisrael are finally escaping from Egypt. They get to the yam suf, cross over the sea, and then begin the journey through the desert to erets yisrael.

How did they know the direction? How is it possible to travel without Waze? Well, they had the best gps system ever! For Hashem was leading them with a pillar of cloud and a pillar of fire.

The Torah says "lo yamish" the pillar of cloud during the day, and the pillar of fire during the night, in front of the people. Most of the classical commentators understand "lo yamish" as being what your English teacher would call a transitive active verb. that is, Hashem would precisely alternate the clouds at the proper moment.

The commentary Baal haturim noted that the only other place in the entire bible where the words "lo yamish" appear in combination are in reference to Joshua's devotion to Moses. Joshua was at Moses' side every evening when the pillar of fire appeared, and every morning as soon as the pillar of cloud appeared.

The Baal haturim learns an important lesson from here: that devotion of student to teacher is why Joshua eventually merited to go in front of the people and to lead them

A NEW YEAR FOR WHAT? Source: TorahTots

SHVAT? The question: Why is this new year in the month of Shvat? The Talmud, Tractate Rosh HaShana tells us that by this point in the year, most of the rainfall to come during the year has already arrived. Therefore, the trees have already started to grow, and this is the time when fruits begin forming on the trees. Because the fruits begin to grow at this time, it is fitting that we start the New Year for the tree (which has significance to the fruits produced and the gifts the fruit are subject to) at this time.

In Eretz Yisrael, the 15th of Shvat is the day when new sap starts to rise in the trees. It is a time of rejuvenation. It teaches us the important lesson that even in times that seem darkest, there is new life, in times of sorrow there is hope, and in times of Galut, (exile) there is the light of Mashiach.

HOW WE

CELEBRATE What better way to celebrate the birthday of trees than to actually plant a tree. There are all kinds of organizations and groups that are

dedicated to planting trees in the forests of Eretz Yisroel. You can also plant a tree in your own neck of the woods if you want to. Tu B'Shvat is the perfect time to protest deforestation and the shrinking of the rain forests, although there's no particular mitzvah to do so.

There are varied customs regarding eating fruit on Tu B'Shvat. Some have the custom of eating the seven species of truits that arow in Eretz Yisroel. This "Top Seven" selection is based on a verse in Devarim: (8,8) "...a land of WHEAT and BARLEY and (GRAPE) VINES and FIG trees and POMEGRANATES, a land of OLIVE trees and (DATE) honeu." Others have a custom of eating fifteen species of fruit (the "top 7" and eight more). In today's "global fruitopia," where fruits from all over the world are available from our grocers, we mix it up: starting with the "top 7", we move on to local fruity favorites and throw in a "new fruit" (that we haven't eaten this year) in order to be able to make the Bracha (blessina) of Shehechiyanu.
