## Dvar Torah Parashat Ki Tissa Summary & Questions!

The portion begins with instructions for taking a census of the Israelites and collecting a "half-shekel" donation from each person. The half-shekel was to be used for the maintenance of the Tabernacle, the portable sanctuary that the Israelites would use to worship God during their travels. The Tabernacle was to be constructed according to precise specifications, with a courtyard, an outer covering made of goat hair, and an inner covering made of fine linen. The inside of the Tabernacle was to contain a number of sacred objects, including an altar, a table for showbread, and a menorah.

Moses then ascends Mount Sinai to receive the Ten Commandments from Hashem. While he is gone, the Israelites become anxious and ask Aaron to make them a new god to worship. Aaron creates a golden calf, and the people begin to worship it. When Moses returns and sees what has happened, he be-

comes angry and smashes the tablets. He pleads with Hashem to spare the people, and Hashem agrees to forgive them on the condition that they repent and return to faithful worship.

The portion then describes the construction of the Tabernacle in greater detail. Moses appoints Bezalel and Oholiab as master craftsmen, and they lead the construction effort. The portion also includes instructions for observing the Sabbath, making anointing oil and incense for use in the Tabernacle, and appointing the priests who will be responsible for offering sacrifices and performing other sacred duties.

The portion ends with Hashem renewing his covenant with the Israelites and promising to guide them on their journey to the Promised Land. This promise is conditional on the Israelites' continued obedience to Hashem's commands and their faithful worship of him. Overall, Parashat Ki Tisa emphasizes the importance of communal responsibility, faithful worship, and obedience to Hashem's commands, while also highlighting the dangers of idolatry and the need for forgiveness and reconciliation. The portion serves as a reminder of the central role that Hash-

em plays in the lives of the Israelites and the importance of following his guidance in all aspects of their lives.

1. What is the significance of the "half-shekel" donation that is required of every Israelite in Parashat Ki Tisa? How does this commandment reflect the values and priorities of the Israelite community, and what might it teach us about the importance of communal responsibility and mutual support?

2. In Parashat Ki Tisa, Hashem reveals the name "YHWH" to Moses and explains its meaning. What is the significance of this name, and how does it relate to the larger themes of the Torah? In what ways might this name reflect Hashem's attributes or qualities, and how might it inform our understanding of the divine?

3. How does the story of the golden calf challenge our assumptions about the Israelites' relationship with Hashem, and what might it teach us about the nature of faith and belief? What role do faith and belief play in our own lives, and how might we ensure that our beliefs are grounded in truth and justice rather than fear or manipulation?

"This shall they give, every one that passes over to the counted ones, half a shekel in the weights of the Sanctuary...."

A coin of fire

Rashi writes here per the Midrash: "Hashem showed Moshe a likeness of a coin of fire whose weight was half a shekel and said to him: Thus shall they give. Sages in Israel ask – Why did G-d show Moshe a coin specifically of fire?

Rabbi Nachman of Breslev explained as follows: There is a similarity between fire and money: Fire is, undoubtedly, one of important and essential thing for a person and the world cannot exist without it, but that same fire can also destroy the entire world.

The same is with money: It is important and helpful if one knows how to use it properly (charity, kindness, etc.) but at the same time it can be very dangerous – if it falls into bad hands.

Words From Rabbi Menahem White KI TISSA' 5783

Dear congregants,

I trust that you had a happy Purim. I missed not reading the megilla in Chevra Shaas at night, and in Hertz during the day. Nevertheless, I was able to perform a mitsvah, as my son-in-law and I traveled to the Lower East Side of Manhattan where we shared responsibility for reading the megilla for his parents, whose health makes them unable to attend the reading at a shul.

We davened maariv in the impressive Bialystoker shul. It was built in 1826 as a church but purchased in 1905 to serve as a shul for the Jews who had come from Bialystok in Poland. The women's section is located in the balcony. There, in the balcony there is a ladder, that leads to an attic. It is told that the attic was used as a hiding place for runaway slaves in the underground railroad, on their way to freedom in Canada.

After the building's conversion to a shul, several large murals depicting Jewish themes were painted, and are clearly visible.

While we are still thinking about Purim, as we eat our remaining

hamantashen, here is an interesting question. What kind of a leader was Achashveirosh? When I would read the Megillah for my students, I would try to have my voice depict him as a fool, who had been manipulated by Haman. However, in the first chapter of Talmud Masechet Megillah, there are two different evaluations. One indeed has him being manipulated. Bur there is another approach that depicts him as a clever antisemite, who had Haman do the dirty work for him. And there is also a tradition in the Talmud that when he made the great feast, as described in the first chapter of Esther, he was prancing around in the garments of the kohen gadol, that had been captured by Nebucadnezer. So, any way you look at it, he wasn't a nice guy.

And, by the way, have you heard that in the new woke edition of the megillah, Ha-man's name has been changed to Ha-person. (LOL)

We pray for peace in Erets Yisrael, and in the world.
